

COURT PROCEEDINGS.

Following is the proceedings of the regular July term of county court, Hon. W. W. Conder, Judge presiding, and D. P. Harvey and L. B. Alley, county commissioners, being present:

The bonds of Sheriff J. H. Jackson, Clerk T. H. Goynes; Treasurer John Barker, and Coroner C. E. Reynolds, approved.

Bill of C. F. Hobart, lumber R. D. 9; continued, should be itemized.

Petition of E. M. Keys to have boundary of School Dist. 17, placed on record according to E. K. Barnard, rejected.

Supervisor R. D. 5 authorized to purchase 2000 feet of lumber at \$10 M; also 40 lbs. spikes at 4 cts.

Financial report of T. B. Handley, School Superintendent, approved.

Petition of Supervisor R. D. 18 for 75 road puncheon, continued.

Appointment of Tom Coates as deputy clerk approved, and his salary fixed at \$800 per year.

Petition of A. W. Fletcher, et al, for road views allowed. Viewers appointed to view road which former viewers neglected.

Petition of H. Booth for road allowed and viewers appointed.

Additional bond of J. H. Jackson as tax-collector, in the sum of \$5,000; approved.

Ordered that clerk sum up cost of viewing and surveying the H. Booth road, so that costs may be collected from the bondsmen.

Bond of Surveyor A. M. Austin in sum of \$500 approved.

Report of J. D. Edwards, Tax-collector, approved, as follows: Amount collected, \$24,809.23; doubly assessed, \$305.60; wrongfully assessed, \$315.53; sworn off, \$178.35; delinquent, \$6494.19.

Bill of H. F. Holden, \$12.80, fees in case of J. W. Maxwell vs Tillamook county, in circuit court, continued for further investigation.

Appointment of H. F. Goodspeed as deputy sheriff, approved.

Ordered that D. C. Collier be fined \$10 for refusing to view the A. W. Fletcher road.

Bid of W. F. D. Jones to furnish 7000 letter heads at \$2.50 per thousand, for county officials, accepted.

Report of Geo. Cohn as County Treasurer, accepted. It appearing that there was a balance of \$5485.08 in the hands of the treasurer, and Geo. Cohn showing a receipt for same from Treasurer elect John Barker, it was ordered that said sum be charged to John Barker.

L. G. Freeman was authorized to put extras on Wilson river bridge, now building, the county agreeing to pay \$60 extra for same.

Ordered that Supervisor repair Trask river bridge.

Ordered that Nathaniel Jones; and indigent soldiers, be relieved to the extent of \$15, money to be expended by Jacob Blum, Post Com.

LATEST STRIKE NEWS.

The following special telegram was sent from Portland today to this paper:

The latest news from the strike is somewhat rather indefinite and conflicting. At Chicago things are quieting down very fast and trains are running. Martial law had its effect. The great general strike threatened failed to come. Eastern mails are arriving and trains are running in Oregon. In California there is some trouble yet. A train carrying soldiers went through a bridge, killing a few men, and parties in ambush fired on the train. The bridge timbers had been partially sawed off. It seems that the present strike is practically over unless new complications arise.
