"Why," said he, "they are selling the ranges at \$20 each, and the farmers are signing notes payable October 1st, with a verbal understanding that the notes needn't be paid for five years if the farmer wishes further time. It is my opinion these notes will be in the hands of a bank for collection as soon as they are due. Besides, you can go to C. E. And, these hard times, it is pretty hard to refuse cold cash for an advertisement, even from outside advertisers, when some of the home merchants can't afford to advertise very liberally.—Ed.]
