Mr. B. H. Luce, Oregon's Food and Dairy Commissioner called Monday on his way to Hillsboro from an official visit to Tillamook County. He said he had heard Tillamook highly spoken of as a dairy country, but found it far beyond his expectations. "It is a great grass county," said Mr. Luce, "and farmers would do well to set their grass land to clover and raise hogs. The hogs will fatten on clover alone, and excellent pork." Mr. Luce says Tillamook's greatest need is good roads. Mr. Luce is a populist in politics and while he does not expect to succeed himself he is of the opinion that the State would do well not to abolish the office. Mr. Luce has made several prosecutions of persons for food adulteration, and is a fearless and honest official. He found no violations of the laws entrusted to his charge, in Tillamook. —Sheridan Sun.

A Serious Case.
