The Editor of the Headlight interviewed both Dr. Wiley and Dr. Hawke with regard to the purity of the well-water here, and both pronounced it decidedly impure, and unfit for drinking purposes.

Dr. Wiley stated that for many months previous to the introduction of the city water his family had boiled all the water they had used in order to destroy disease germs, and that he had in many cases recommended others to do so.

Dr. Hawke was quite as decided in his opinion. He too had several cases of typhoid fever, which he attributed to the use of impure water from our wells.

We understand that Dr. Wiley has forwarded some samples of well-water, and also a sample of water from the water works, to Portland for analysis.
