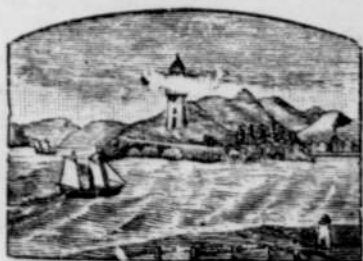

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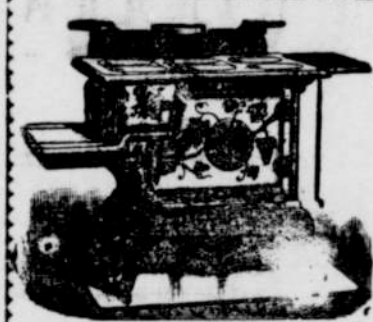

Hogwart slough. Mr. Holcombe's

steersman, John Herrington, tide reader,
and John Day, Charles Handley, Elmer
