Brief Description of Its Climate Resources etc.

Tillamook County is at the same time one of the least known and one of the best of all the comparatively new counties of the great State of Oregon.

PRODUCTIVENESS The soil of Tillamook is unequalled for richness and depth. The prairies are of comparatively small area, but are excellent for grass.

RESOURCES The resources of Tillamook county are numerous but consist mainly in dairying and fishing.

DAIRYING For this industry Tillamook County is doubtless the best section of country in the United States.

FISHING Fishing is carried on extensively and there are large canneries located at different points in the county.

OTHER INDUSTRIES Aside from these principal industries there are others that will in time develop into considerable importance.

POPULATION The population of Tillamook County is mostly a rural population. It is estimated that it amounts to about Five Thousand, of which about two thirds is in the rural districts.

TRANSPORTATION AND ROADS The public roads of Tillamook are said to be the best of any in the entire state.
