

WAR NEWS!

SATURDAY 10:30 A. M.

The Spanish fleet sailed yesterday from Martinique for Havana. The fleet consists of 77 formidable warships. Samson has gone to meet them, and will be joined by the flying squadron under Commodore Schley. The great naval battle of the war will probably be fought with in one or two days.

At the bombardment of San Juan the Monitor Terror, received the enemy's hottest fire for a full half hour without suffering the least injury. The people at Nuevas, Cuba are in a state of starvation. Spanish soldiers are deserting and going over to the insurgents.

Blanco has sent a dispatch to Madrid to the effect that the Americans bombarded Bahis Honda, a small port west of Cardenas. The state department at Washington makes official denial of the report that the French liner La Fayette had on board any contraband goods or supplies for the Spanish army, or any Spanish officers.

Now that the Spanish fleet has been located, an effort will be made to crush it without loss of time, and the campaign will be pressed with ceaseless vigor. Gen. Lee says that Cardenas is a strategic point and must be taken. It is believed that a part of the Spanish fleet is off the coast of New England. Orders have been issued to remove all women and children from Port Warren in view of a possible bombardment.

SATURDAY 8:00 P. M.

A Spanish fleet is now off Venezuelan coast apparently making for Havana. It is evidently axious to avoid Samson's fleet, and it is believed it has instructions to apparently sail for Porto Rico and do a large amount on the South side of Cuba. Spain fears another Manila, and it is believed she has instructed her fleet to avoid a battle on the open sea.

It is conceded on the continent of Europe that the Philippines are utterly lost. Spain, in case that America should relinquish the prize some one of the European powers, other than Spain, will get the islands. All covet them.

A battle has occurred at Cienfuegos between the American cruisers Marblehead, Nashville and Winslow, and the Spanish forts. Great damage was inflicted on the Spaniards. The American loss was 1 man killed and 6 wounded. The Spanish cable at that point has been cut.

Cuban insurgents have taken Bayamo and are now in full control at that place. Spain admits to having lost 300 killed and 600 wounded at Manila.

Spain has complained to France for allowing American warships in one of her West India harbors.

MONDAY 11:30 P. M.

Samson's fleet and the Cape Verde fleet are as far apart as ever and it is impossible to say when Samson will be able to corner the Spaniards and make them fight.

The flying squadron under Commodore Schley is hastening southward. It was reported at Charleston S. C. Saturday at 5:30 P. M. The Key West fleet is coaling for some kind of movement.

Several Spanish torpedo boats are said to be disabled at Martinique. Dawey has not yet attacked the City of Manila. He has telegraphed that the City is surrounded by the insurgents and he can take it at any time. It is expected the City will surrender in a few days. Dewey captured another Spanish gunboat, the Vallejo, Saturday.

The Captain of the Vallejo did not know of the war and steamed right under Dewey's guns, a few shots from which caused him to quickly surrender.

The reconcentrados in Cuba are nearly all dead. The Spanish soldiers are driving them out of the town into the country. Blanco suppressed the news of Dewey's victory at Manila and the people of Havana have just received the news, which to them is very demoralizing.

Several Spanish ministers have resigned at Madrid, but Sagasta is still in authority.

MONDAY, MAY 16 7:30 P. M.

The Spanish fleet is off again. The last of the war ships sailed from Curacoa yesterday for an unknown destination. The departure was enforced by the governor of the island. It is believed that the plan of the Spanish admiral is to avoid our battleships and attack only our gunboats and coast cities.

A new American Squadron, headed by the battleship Oregon is reported off Martinique ready to do battle with the Spanish fleet should it dare to return.

A special dispatch from Washington to the New York Journal says; President McKinley had ordered his personal blockade idea and orders were telegraphed today to the blockading squadron to turn all the ships loose on all Spanish forts where resistance is offered. Every Cuban city that is fortified will be attacked and bombarded until every Spanish gun is silenced.

The last gunboat captured by Dewey is a boat of 308 tons burden, with 4 modern guns. It is added to Dewey's fleet.

It is probable that in the near future the president will ask for 500,000 more fighting vessels. The Spanish cabinet has resigned in a body and Sagasta will form a new one, more warlike than the preceding cabinet.

TUESDAY, MAY 17, 10:30 A. M.

Samson's fleet north of Cape Hayti but the destination is unknown.

The Spanish torpedo boat Terror is at Fort de France, undergoing repairs.

The U. S. Auxiliary Steamer Yale which the Spanish claimed to have captured passed St. Thomas yesterday sailing westward.

A number of new Spanish warships that have hitherto been without armor have been supplied with Krupp guns and German Artillerists and have been added to the Spanish fleet.

The Spanish Cape Verde fleet sailed and provisioned at Curacoa yesterday and sailed thence westward.

The last of the Oregon troops left Portland yesterday.

The Porto Rican Government will allow no more telegraphic messages sent to the U. S.

The Hawaiian Government has refused to issue a proclamation of neutrality. Japan has issued a protest against America's seizing the Philippines.

TUESDAY, MAY 7:30 P. M.

Samson's fleet and the flying squadron will unite in a campaign against the Spanish fleet and a great naval battle is confidently expected soon.

The coast of Cuba is carefully patrolled and a sharp lookout kept for the Spanish fleet. Thousands of Cubans are being forced into the Spanish army. All Cubans have received orders from the patriot government not to resist conscription. The Cubans will thus fill the Spanish army with patriots ready to betray it to destruction whenever opportunity shall offer.

Spain is busy organizing a new expedition of naval vessels and transports and will make an effort to retake the Philippines.

England has lately become the object of Spain's bitterest wrath and is now execrated amongst all classes of Spaniards. England's friendship for America is the cause.

Mexico has expressed cordial sympathy with the United States. U. S. naval officers complain that too much publicity is given to their plans and movements and the government will make an effort to observe greater secrecy.

WEDNESDAY, 10:30 A. M.

A fleet of warships, believed to be Samson's fleet was sighted off the coast of Jamaica yesterday, headed southward. The Spanish fleet is believed to be scattered, some of the ships being seen off the coast of Venezuela and others among the Windward Islands. The navy de-

partment is said to have changed its plans, and it is probable that no general naval battle will take place in west Indian waters. The Spanish Destroyer Terror will sail today. Dewey is still maintaining a strict blockade. Insurgents of the island are of little use to him. 2 small Spanish gunboats are at the harbor of Guayaquil, in Ecuador. Blanco refuses to exchange the 2 newspapermen recently captured by him, and it is probable that they will be executed as spies.

Ordinance No. 105.

An ordinance to provide for the construction of a certain sidewalk, and to provide for the cost of building the same.

The people of Tillamook City, do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. That a sidewalk shall be built in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 101, on the east side of Stillwell Avenue, beginning at the south west corner of Lot 5, in block 2 of Hayes addition to Tillamook City, running thence North, to the Northwest corner of said Lot and connecting with the sidewalk at the Southwest corner of Lot 4, in Block 2.
Sec. 2. That an assessment of 25 cents per front foot, be and is hereby levied, on Lot 5, in block 2, in Hayes addition to Tillamook City, for the purpose of paying for the cost of the material and the cost of the construction of the said sidewalk.

Sec. 3. The construction of such sidewalk, shall be completed on or before the 1st, day of June 1898, and upon the failure of the owner or owners of the said Lot mentioned in Sec. 1, and 2, to build and complete such sidewalk on or before the 26th day of May 1898 the Street Commissioner, shall proceed to build and construct said sidewalk as provided by law.

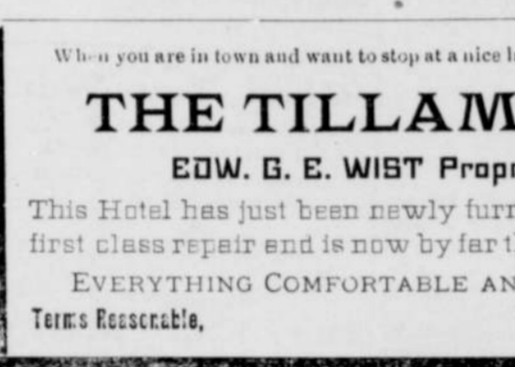
