

A Letter From Thos. H. Tongue.

Hon. R. J. Hendricks, of Salem, chairman of the republican congressional committee, first district, has received the following letter from Representative Tongue:

WASHINGTON, D. C. May 16, 1898.—Hon. R. J. Hendricks, Salem, Or.—Dear Sir: I had hoped to be in Oregon at least one week during the campaign, thinking that could be done without neglect of duty here. I find now that will be impossible. The revenue bill providing for an energetic conduct of the war, while it passed the house long ago, has not yet passed the senate, and the probabilities are that it will not do so for some time. Amendments have been proposed that cannot possibly be assented to by the house. The combined opposition to the administration, while clamoring loudly for a declaration of war, when the country had not a man or ship ready, and when immediate hostile action would have been extremely dangerous, now that war has been declared, and we face to face with an armed enemy, refuse to vote for any practical measure, necessary to supply the government with funds needed for vigorous action and speedy victory. Soldiers and sailors must be paid, materials of war must be bought. Ample supplies are as necessary as guns and men. They cannot be had without money. We need them and we need them now.

Delay is dangerous: white soldiers and sailors are risking life and limb in perilous battle they should be paid in money, every dollar of which will purchase a dollar's worth of supplies for families at home. To undertake to cut down their wages by payment in money of uncertain value or by payment in promises, which every one knows could not be redeemed now, and the redemption of which no man can predict, would be unparliamentary and dishonorable. To make war revenues dependent upon the decision of the supreme court in litigation to sustain an income tax, which has already been decided against us, would be equally disastrous. To prosecute the war efficiently and vigorously to a speedy determination and a glorious victory is the patriotic and imperative duty of the administration.

This cannot be done without the necessary means. They should be furnished at once and without equivocation. We are engaged in actual and perilous warfare. Foreign nations are restless and jealous of our success. Dangerous foreign complications may arise. It is no time to indulge in any untried experiments, or wild, visionary, financial schemes. If we must indulge them, let us reserve the experiment to less perilous times. We cannot afford to do it now, while our sailors and soldiers in two hemispheres are risking life and limb in defense of national honor, we cannot afford to tarnish it, or diminish the luster of their victories, by engaging in schemes of repudiation or quibbling attempts to cheat them out of a portion of their compensation. So long as these important questions are pending and undecided, every friend of the administration, every member of congress who is in favor of a vigorous prosecution of the war to a speedy and successful issue must remain at his post of duty. Country must be placed above party, and victory over our foreign enemies regarded as of more importance than political contention. Very truly and sincerely, yours, THOS. H. TONGUE.

He quoted garbled extracts from Lincoln Blaine and Garfield eulogized those departed statesmen but forgot to tell us that during their lives he was one of their bitter traducers. His address was given in good style, and apart from his sophistries was as good as good as could be expected from an intelligent advocate of confusion.
