

WAR NEWS!

MONDAY. The first land battle was fought last Saturday between the Spanish and American forces at Santiamo. The American marines were attacked by the Spanish Guerrillas on regulars and the fight lasted all Saturday night in which the Spanish were defeated. Our loss was 4 men killed and 11 wounded. Spanish loss unknown.

Simpson is in control of lower Guantanamo bay and is dragging for mines. The Spaniards hold the upper part of the bay and have 2 small warships, which Simpson will either capture or sink as soon as he gets ready.

The army of invasion left yesterday under the escort of a powerful convoy. It consisted of 17,000 men. It is their purpose to lay siege to Santiago.

15,000 troops left this morning from Key West for Santiago and expect to arrive there not later than Thursday. From 10,000 to 15,000 troops will leave in a few days for Porto Rico.

The prize captured by the St. Louis, a few days ago, was a British Collier loaded with coal for Cervera.

The Cadiz fleet was found to be unfit for sea and hence will not trouble Uncle Sam.

Uncle Sam is preparing to use carrier pigeons in his war with Spain.

The war revenue bill is now a law having been signed by the President and vice-president.

TUESDAY. The American hospital ship, Solace, is at Guantanamo caring for the wounded marines. The dead are being buried where they fell in Cuba.

Secretary Gage has called for subscriptions for \$200,000.00 bonds to bear interest at 3 per cent per annum.

The expedition that left Key West yesterday was supplied with provisions for 60 days.
