Please allow me to offer a few words of warning to the hay makers of Tillamook county in regard to the action of the weather that takes place on the cellpses in harvest time or mid-summer: I have records of the weather from 1846 up to date and am able to show the class of weather we have had and may expect to have at the time of the mid-summer eclipses and the amount of damage done to the hay and grain, cut at that time, by persons not having faith in the weather signs. I say to those farmers who are wise enough to be governed in the present and future by the actions of authentic weather records of the past, let them watch the winds and weather about the time of the cellpses on the 3d and 18th of July 1898. It matters not whether these cellpses are visible or not, ny records show that more or less storm occars with them.

Mr. Edi'or, believing that I have given abstracts enough to satisfy those who will take heed to the warning enough to save their winters feed by not cutting more than they can care for, and keeping a good lookout on tha winds and "halos" around the sun, I will take no more of your valuable space.
