Portland Market As given by Allen & Lewis. WHEAT—Practically no business going on. Nominal value for Eastern Oregon, 60c to 62c. OATS—There has been no material change in the market price, but owing to the decline in barley and wheat the market shows weakness. BARLEY—The market is well supplied. Nominal values at \$20.00 to \$21.00. GROCERIES—Tomatoes, corn higher, tobacco higher. BUTTER—Shipments to California keeps the market well cleaned up, especially in the cheaper grades. Creamery 30c to 35c; dairy 25c to 30c. Store, 20c to 25c. POULTRY—Receipts continue small except for springs. There is no sale for old ducks except at very low figures. EGGS—The receipts have been small and prices have advanced to 13c. DRIED FRUITS—Apples, sun dried, quarters 3 1/2 to 4 1/2c, sliced 4c to 5c, evaporated bleached 5 1/2 to 6c; plums, sun dried, pitless 3c to 4c; nut chine dried dried pitless 4c to 5c; prunes, Italian, 1 1/2 to 1 3/4c, French 1 1/2 to 1 3/4c. POTATOES—30c to 35c per sack. PEELS—Good demand at 9c @ 10c. HIDES—Dry, 1 1/4 to 1 1/2c; green 6c to 7c. WOOL—Valley, 1 1/4 to 1 1/2c; Eastern Oregon, 9 1/2 to 10c. PEARS—Sun and evaporated, 3 1/2 to 4c. CHICKENS—\$3.50 to \$4.00; springs \$2.00 @ \$3.00. TURKEYS—Live, 12 1/2 to 13c for choice, dressed 14 @ 15c. DUCKS—Young, \$3.00 @ \$4.00. GESESE—\$1.00 @ 4.00. OATS—No. 1 white, 35 @ 40c; 37 @ 39c for choice.
