The nations of Europe will have to revise their opinions of the American Navy. At the time of the commencement of the war the opinion was freely expressed by European diplomats that the Spanish navy was superior to ours and that before the war was over the United States would have far less of a navy than it had then. It was also predicted, even by some English naval writers that about the first broadside our ships undertook to fire they would upset. Thus far they have, it is true, done some upsetting, but the upsetting was done by the ships at the muzzle end of the guns.

If America were fighting any other nation than Spain we might reckon on the war now being brought to a speedy close. With two thirds of her navy at the bottom of the sea and nearly all her island possessions wrested from her it seems she should be willing to quit. But the ignorance and silly pride of that nation must be taken into consideration in computing the chances on what she will or will not do. A few more victories like those of Manila and Santiago and Spain's alleged ability to do any fighting at sea will be done with, at any rate.

When asked to surrender Santiago, General Linares proudly answered that he had 100,000 Spaniards in Santiago ready to die for Cuba. The general probably lied about 80,000 men, but if he has 100,000 men who are ready to die the best thing to be done is doubtless to kill them. They will probably never be better prepared. A dead Spaniard is a good Spaniard but a live Spaniard is an uncertain quantity.

Tillamook needs a new brass band, one composed of musicians who are fond of their art and who are willing to work, not for the honor or the glory or the "stuf" there is in it but for the love of music itself. We have the talent right here if it could only be gotten together. A brass band like the Hillsboro band which visited us on the fourth of July is a credit to any town.

Emperor Billy is probably congratulating himself by this time that he kept his nose out of that Manila business. The American navy may do for the servile German press to rail at, but even so conceded a fool as Emperor Billy can see that it isn't quite a safe thing to monkey with.

The commencement exercises at St. Alphonsus Academy last night demonstrated the fact that Tillamook County can boast of a first class educational institution, one that is a credit to the county and the state. The program was of a very high order and excellently rendered.

The utter inability of Spanish gunners to hit anything is becoming positively ridiculous. Of what use is a navy to Spain anyway? Tillamook county could furnish a hundred boys under 16 years of age that could give Spanish gunners pointers on shooting.

When Cervera succeeded in bottling himself up in Santiago harbor the queen sent her congratulations. She will now probably congratulate him on the wonderful feat of having gotten out and showing the world how a Spaniard can die.
