I would have written sooner, but have been too busy either drilling or on duty in the kitchen scraping pots or washing dishes. There are about 15,000 soldiers here in this camp. Some will leave tomorrow, but we will not leave for a bout three weeks.

When we left Portland the ladies gave each of us a bag called the "Soldier's Wife," containing needles, pins, buttons a bar of soap, a towel, a night cap, a bandage to go around our stomach, a lead pencil, a tablet, a small bible, envelopes, and a box of stationery.

When we landed here the ladies gave us a fine breakfast and treated us royally. Since we arrived we have been sleeping on the hard floor in a barn. They will not let us sleep on straw, because it is unhealthy.

We do not have very good meals here, just meat, spuds, bread and coffee, with out sugar. We all have to be vaccinated. Some of the boys fainted away just from a little scratching on the arm. There are about 150 Oregon boys here in this barn, but we expect to get tents today and live in style. No more at this time. I am well.

The United States League of Local Loan and Building Associations by their delegates in convention assembled:
First.—That it is the sense of this meeting that the interests of all shareholders of building and loan associations in the United States demand that the present standard of values, upon which our monetary system has been based since the resumption of specie payments in 1879, shall remain unchallenged and inviolate.

Benefits of High Prices.

Why Dollars Would Be Cheap.
The cry of the silver adherents is that silver is the money of the poor, while gold is the money of the rich. But silver will be the money of the poor and rich alike when we are on the silver basis, just as paper was the money of rich and poor alike when we were on a paper basis. The buying power of silver will be exactly what the buying power of paper was—i. e., its value relative to gold. If silver is worth one-half of what gold is, it will buy one-half of what gold will. That is a law of trade as immutable as the law of gravitation or any law of nature.—Boston Herald.
