Germany claims that our conduct towards that country for a long time has been particularly irritating and exasperating. The charge is as utterly foundationless as is the intermeddling of Germany at Manila. The only fault Germany can possibly find with us is that in our tariff regulations we protect our selves against the pauper labor of Europe, and surely that is a matter which is strictly our own business.

The HEADLIGHT has frequently called attention to the lawlessness manifest amongst some of the young toughs of Tillamook. Last week that spirit manifested itself once more—this time the young toughs whoever they were broke the large pane of glass in the bay window of Mr. Olsen's new residence. Aside from the value of the glass (which is about ten dollars) it is difficult to ship a new pane in, from Portland, as there is great danger of breakage. Young toughs who are guilty of such conduct are rapidly fitting themselves for the penitentiary.

Americans who are growing nervous over the prospect of trouble with Germany over the settlement as to the final disposition of the Philippines, should remember that the only European country which has any real interest in the Philippines is England, and as she is particularly anxious that America shall retain the islands, it is not likely that she will allow Germany, whose only interest is the protection of a few peregrinating Dutch peddlers, to make any serious trouble. But with or without the assistance of England, America does not fear the "malled fist" of Germany.

If Admiral Sampson is as great a man as he is represented to be he should have been above the mean petty treatment he accorded to Commodore Schley in the Santiago affair. That he was not in a position to take part in the sinking of Cervera's fleet was not his fault but that he selfishly endeavored to appropriate the glory belonging to his gallant companion in arms, even to the extent of refusing to allow Schley to receive the surrender of a fort which he had conquered was something far beneath the dignity of an American officer.

If the meddlesome German admiral, at Manila, continues to poke his nose into Dewey's business there is likely to be a bad mixture of thick German blood and sour kroust over there. But the doughy German did know enough to get out of the way, when Dewey, contrary to his orders pitched into the Spaniards in Subig bay. If Billy Underlands his business he will call the meddlesome Diedrich home, and send a man to Manila who knows the difference between a Chinaman and an American. Americans don't bluff.

The report that a Spanish privateer has been fitted out on the coast of British Columbia and is now preparing to prey on our coast commerce is evidently credited by both the American and British authorities and steps have been taken to capture such vessel if it really exists. The best place for a pirate (and according to the modern interpretation a privateer) is at the end of a rope dangling from the yard arm of a vessel and the quicker the fellows, who man the privateer in question, are brought to such an end, the better.
