Prince Bismarck.

The death of Prince Bismarck removes from the ranks of German statesmen their brightest and ablest mind. It was through the remarkable statesmanship of Bismarck aided by the sword of Gen. Von Moltke and the great executive ability of Emperor William 1st that Germany developed from a third rate power to one of the great powers of the earth.

He was a figure of splendid positive power in statesmanship and has left his impress ineffaceably on the map of Europe. He was in tensely German and where the interests of Germany were involved intensely selfish, a fact which America has frequently had cause to regret. As a result he was as cordially disliked by other countries as he was beloved by his own people. During the reign of the old Emperor William his abilities were recognized to the fullest extent and in all the great plans that finally resulted in the evolution of the German Empire, Bismarck was the master mind. William gladly recognized his genius and profited by it. But with the advent of the present all sufficient emperor Bismarck was pushed aside and given to understand that his counsels were not needed. Bismarck naturally resented this treatment and his life was somewhat embittered thereby but he possessed the love and confidence of the German people to the end. On account of his dislike to this country and his many acts of unfridliness Bismarck though his great ability was always recognized was never much beloved on this side of the Atlantic.

The London Times is correct in its assertion that "if Spain is permitted to reassume sovereignty over the Philippines she will have to engage in a war of conquest which might be attended with serious consequences to American and other interests in the Pacific." The ultimate fate of the Philippines is somewhat uncertain, but it is entirely certain that Spain's control over them will never be restored. When we complete the conquest of them, as we will if the war lasts two months longer, they will be out of Spain's hands forever. One of the terms of peace if, peace comes as a consequence of Spain's present move, or pretended move, in that direction, will probably be the relinquishment of all Spain's authority in the Philippines, and the authority, when it is given up, will never be resumed. The exact disposition which the United States will make of the islands can not be determined until careful consideration is given to the question after the war ends, but they will never be returned to Spain.—Globe Democrat.
