Trade follows the flag. The greatest direct gainer by our war with Spain is to be the Pacific coast. The planting of the American flag in Hawaii and in the Philippines means the establishment of thriving American centers of trade in the heart of the Pacific.

The Pacific coast is within easy reach of the newest American possessions, and also of the west coast of South America, China, Japan and Oceania, but it has not taken advantage of its situation.

The completion of the Isthmian canal would bring the East within easier reach of the Orient, but before this great work can be finished the world will see a surprising development of manufactures and commerce on the Pacific coast.

The star of empire moves westward still, and it is moving more swiftly than ever now, while it follows the American flag. Go to the Pacific coast, young man.

From the Oregonian. This is Oregon's great year. While 1897 showed by far the richest returns from the soil ever known in history of the state, the year 1898 is certain to beat that incomparable record.

The season has advanced so far that the wheat yield may be spoken of with certainty. Last year's actual product was 41,268,000 bushels.

Of Oregon's industries, outside of the grain, the one at present most active is lumber. The demand, while not exceeding that of last year, is very heavy.

Millions will be added to the permanent wealth of Oregon. This will bring the total wheat crop up to 45,000,000 bushels or over.

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marketed. By advantage of its tariffs, consumers in these sections can get cheap Texas and Arkansas lumber at less cost than they can obtain the superior Oregon product.

The wool clip equals the yield of last year, which was about 18,000,000 pounds. That is conceded by some of the best authorities in the city. But the prices will be far higher. The advance up to date is estimated at fully 25 per cent, and very few growers, if any, are parting with their stock at present quotations.
