

THE FROZEN NORTH

Some Facts Given to us by Ex-Sheriff Jackson About Alaska.

After a long conversation with ex-sheriff Jackson, we find he has enough experience of Alaska and Klondike to fill a large book. He has all he wants at any rate.

Mr. Jackson left here Aug. 8, 1897 and on reaching Seattle left for St. Michaels with his party. It took 19 days for them to build a boat, which was a stern wheeler 160 feet long and in this they went up the river as soon as they could, prospecting as they went.

For one to get a good description of the country, it is necessary to visit and travel over it. In the winter time every thing is frozen up solid and one must have their camp well protected and have lots of furs to keep from freezing.

Although there is no light from the sun during the winter months, the Aurora Borealis furnishes enough light to work by. In the summer, when there is no night, the ground thaws out to the depth of from one to two feet and is hard to travel over.

It breeds millions of mosquitos and knuts, which fly up in front of the traveler often hiding the sun from his view. A person sleeps there in the summer, when ever they become exhausted and need rest, then the mosquitos and knuts are busy, so that one gets but little rest.

The winter months are far preferable for mining and is really the only time mining can be done, except on the high benches. Then the ground is frozen solid as far down as one can go, and a hole can be burned quite easily.

In the summer, on the other hand, the ground is thawed out for a foot or two and as fast as you scrape off the top, more runs in and a fire is put out immediately.

Although there is lots of gold up there, it is very much over-estimated. To make a mine pay, it must be very rich. By the time one pays his expenses even on a rich find he has very little left.

The best of mining experts all over the country who have been up there say that the out put this year will be between 5 and 6 million dollars, which is quite different from the estimate made by the transportation companies on the sound.
