

## Odds and Ends.

The La Grande sugar factory will be completed in about three weeks. Over 200 men are at work.

Ground has been broken for a brick building to be erected on the Odd Fellows in Hillsboro.

Cornelius is thriving. The new sugar mill has greatly benefitted business. Several dwellings are being built.

Month normal school examinations for entrance begin September 14, but school does not open until September 20.

Hunters were in nearly every field in Lane county Thursday after pheasants. One firm in Eugene sold 4215 shells Wednesday.

Washington county spent last year for school purposes \$39,399.73. Of this amount, over \$26,000 was spent for teacher's salaries.

Father T. H. Small, of Silverton who preached in the Presbyterian church at McMinville, last Sunday is probably the oldest preacher of any denomination on the Pacific coast. He is 89 years of age.

A bed of brown lignite coal has been discovered near Love creek, one and one-half miles south of Powder river, and 20 miles from Baker City. The ground has been located by L. Van, H. D. McGowan and John S. Heck.

Shoalwater bay oysters have risen 75 cents per sack within the past week. They are now worth \$2.75 per sack at the beach and \$2.70 at Astoria. The rise is occasioned by the increase in demand in California, which oyster men are unable to supply.

Congressman T. H. Tongue reports a very queer state of affairs in portions of Alaska. He states that the famous Trookwill mine near Juneau, pays no taxes whatever, and that such occurrences are very frequent. This mine is a very valuable property and turns out several million dollars' worth of gold bullion each year.

## Biggest Flag Yet

What is said of to be the largest flag in the world was swung in the breeze at Tyrone, Pa., last week with appropriate ceremonies. The flag floats between the two mountain ranges at the eastern entrance of the town, over the Juniata river. The cable from which the monster flag is suspended is about one-half inch thick, and weighs 1,740 pounds. The flag is 60x100 feet, and for its construction 1,000 yards of bunting were used. It floats 628 feet above the town.

## From Sheep To Suit.

An experiment to establish the time necessary to produce a suit of clothes from wool yet on the sheep was recently undertaken by the Stroudsburg, (Pa.) Woollen Mills. The shearing was done at 7 o'clock in the morning, and by one o'clock the wool has passed through all the various processes of the mill and tailor shop, and in the shape of a complete and finished suit was being worn by the mill proprietor. This achievement breaks another world's record. Previous to the experiment the quickest time was eight hours, made by a mill at Galashiels, Scotland.
