Town Council.

The Bond of J. S. Laimar for keeping a saloon approved and receipt for license filed. Ordinance No. 108 an ordinance relating to the general peace, health and welfare of the city was adopted by the council and approved by Mayor Eddy.

Ordinance No. 108.

An Ordinance to amend ordinance No. 63 relating to the general peace health and welfare of the City.

The people of Tillamook City do ordain as follows.

1.—That every house, boat, booth, tent or building or structure of whatever kind of nature, within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, in which there shall reside, lodge or frequent, any person or persons, who have been exposed to, inoculated, or effected with small-pox, diphtheria, scarlet-fever, measles or any other malignant infectious or contagious disease, together with such persons, shall be subjected to the laws and regulations mentioned.

2.—That whenever the health officers provide for in section 4, of this ordinance shall learn by rumor or otherwise, that any person within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, has been exposed to, inoculated or effected with small-pox, diphtheria, measles, scarlet-fever or any other malignant, infectious or contagious disease, it shall be his duty to make an immediate and thorough investigation of the cause of such rumor, and if he be satisfied of the existence of any of the diseases mentioned in this ordinance he shall at once declare the house, boat, booth, tent, or other building or structure of what kind of nature in which any person shall frequent or abide in, together with such person or persons so exposed to, inoculated or effected, to be in a state of quarantine by the display of a danger flag or signal, to be displayed in a public place, and the flag or signal used for small-pox, shall be of a red color, for diphtheria, black, for measles or scarlet-fever, yellow, and for any other malignant or contagious diseases, orange; and when any such flag shall be displayed on any premises, said premises shall be deemed in a state of quarantine.

3.—Every house, boat, booth, tent, building or structure on any kind whatever, and every person suffering or effected with, or exposed to, any of the diseases mentioned in this ordinance who shall reside or lodge therein, or frequent such place, shall remain in a state of quarantine until the health officer is satisfied of the complete extermination of such disease, and until such house, boat, booth, tent, building or structure of whatever kind or nature together with all the clothing, bedding and other contents shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

4.—The Mayor is hereby empowered by this ordinance to appoint a health officer, who shall be a regular licensed physician within the state of Oregon.

5.—It is hereby made the duty of any practicing physician or any other person having reason to believe that any of the diseases mentioned in this ordinance or any other infectious or contagious diseases exists within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, to immediately notify the health officer thereof.

6.—The health officer appointed under the provisions of this ordinance is empowered to prohibit the coming within the corporate limits of Tillamook City any person or persons whom he has reason to believe are infected with, or have been exposed to any diseases mentioned in this ordinance or any other malignant or contagious disease; and he shall call upon the City Marshal or Police to enforce his order, and to do any, and all acts necessary to the complete isolation and extermination of any and all such diseases.

7.—Whenever any disease referred to in this ordinance, shall have ceased to exist in any house, boat, booth, tent or other building or structure within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, it shall be the duty of the health officer to immediately renovate and disinfect with substances approved by medical science for the purpose, any such structure and its surroundings and contents, including clothing and inmates, and out buildings and their contents; such disinfection shall be done under the immediate direction of the health officer; and at the expense of Tillamook City.

8.—When any premises in Tillamook City shall be under quarantine, no person shall leave said premises and go upon the streets of Tillamook City without first obtaining permission of said health officer. No person who has been exposed to, or is infected or inoculated with any disease referred to in this ordinance being at the time outside of the limits of Tillamook City, shall come within said limits without the express permission of the health officer, and then only such regulations as said officer may prescribe. No person shall in any manner hinder the health officer in the performance of his duties under this ordinance or refuse said officer access to any premises without Tillamook City at any reasonable time for the purpose of inspecting or disinfecting the same. Any person violating any of the provisions of

this ordinance shall upon conviction therefore, be fined in the sum of not less than five dollars, or not more than fifty dollars, and the cost of prosecution, and in default thereof, to be imprisoned in the City Jail, one day for each two dollars of such fine.
