SHERMAN SQUEALS.

Gives away an Important Cabinet Secret.

CHACIGO, Dec. 20 .- A special to the Tribune from Washington says: Former Secretary of State John Sherman, in an interview, tells an interesting cabinet secret, which in the days before the war was frequently suspected, but never established. With considerable emotion the ex-secretary said:

"I tried to prevent this foolish war with Spain. As matter of fact negotiations were already in progress to purchaseCuba from Spain when the war feeling suddenly rose and swept everything before it. And Spain would have accepted the terms.

"This is a matter of secret history. And now what have we got to show for all this expence? Some islands in the Philoppines, for instances, which are worth about \$200,000 per annum income; increased indebtedness of \$200,000,000 and a lot of islands inhabited mainly by man caters. And the most destressing feature of the affair is that we are now about to be called upon to pay \$20,000,000 for territory that we could have taken without expending a dollar."
