St. Alphonsus ACADEMY, TILLAMOOK, OREGON. CLASSES WERE RESUMED ON THE FIRST MONDAY IN SEPTEMBER. GRADED COURSE OF INSTRUCTION. ST. ALPHONSUS ACADEMY is divided into four departments, viz: Primary, Intermediate Grammar, and Senior. The year is divided into four terms of eleven weeks each.

TUITION FEE. Tuition Fee for one pupil for a term of eleven weeks in the Primary Department, Two Dollars; in the Intermediate, Three Dollars; Grammar Grade, Four Dollars; Senior Grade, Five Dollars.
