Scarcity of harvest hands in Illinois is forcing farmers to work Saturdays. Republican prosperity has set all the idle hands to work.

Records are being broken in every line of commercial and industrial enterprise in the United States this year. The manufacturing establishments of the nation are working overtime and refusing contracts because of their inability to care for the orders in hand.

According to a dispatch from Cape Town the Transvaal government has informed the British secretary of state for the colonies, Mr. Chamberlain, that it adheres to its latest proposals and will offer no further concessions.

The Dreyfus case has served to bring out more despicably and more heroic figures than any trial of recent years. Some of the characters brought into light are beneath contempt.

An Indianapolis paper having asserted that in the enlistment of troops for the Philippines the south has been discriminated against, the Baltimore Sun thus comments: "The lack of enthusiasm in the south is not due to antipathy to a sectional feeling."

The state of Kentucky has just met with an irreparable loss in the death of William Henderson at the advanced age of 94 years. Mr. Henderson had passed a remarkable life. From boyhood on he drank, chewed and smoked, and for the last forty years of his life he drank half a gallon of whisky a day.

Considerable commotion is supposed to be caused at Washington by the discovery that our maps of Porto Rico are inaccurate and defective. When our maps of the Philippines come to be tested by actual surveys we may learn that we have been short change in the far east also.

There are eastern democrats who are hopeful that the party can be reunited for the next national campaign. Among these is ex-Governor Pattison, of Pennsylvania, who has been talked of as a presidential possibility.

The report that Brazil, the Argentine Republic and Paraguay are negotiating an alliance the object of which is to counterbalance the influence of the United States in South American affairs, appears incredibly in view of the entirely friendly relations between each of those republics and this country and the fact that the United States has exerted no influence in South American affairs except for the purpose of assuring its protection to the states of that continent against foreign aggression.

It is worth while observing that one of the anti-everything newspapers, which usually open their mouths only to bawl that expansion, or the army, or the executive limited, that General Fitzhugh Lee was sidetracked and placed in charge of a camp of instruction and that while he was the best equipped man for military operations on a large scale was that the southern troops were not sent to Cuba and that the troops used to supplement the regulars were composed exclusively of northern and western men; that while General Wheeler was given a command, he was subordinate to a general "to whom he could have taught the art of war and whose knowledge of military operations on a large scale was the executive limited."

price of meat it says truly, that the cause is that the supply has run low and that when there is a less demand or a larger supply prices will regulate themselves accordingly. It adds: "Meat throughout the East, and especially in New York, is now selling at prices that make live stock an exceedingly profitable thing to raise. Any farmer who has any animal fit for the butcher has some right to be as good as gold. And it is not necessary to have a section of Western bottom land to make money in this way. The rockiest abandoned farm in Vermont can be made to support stock. The people in the cities are clamoring for meat. The farmers want money. Let demand and supply come together here and both sides will be happy." Or, in other words, the American people as a whole are making so much more money than formerly that they can afford to eat more meat than ever before, and, wanting it, they go out to buy it.

The London Statist, a leading British authority on financial and commercial affairs, predicts an increase of prosperity in the United States. It looks for continued large exports of wheat from this country to western Europe where the demand promises to be fully up to that of the last year, and also that foreign orders for locomotives, steel, etc., will be on an increasing scale.
