

COMMISSIONERS' COURT.

How and Where the Tax Money Goes.

The board of county commissioners met last week, with County Judge G. W. Sappington and Commissioners Ray and Wheeler present, when the following business was transacted:

In the matter of a road granted by C. R. Morton, upon the petition of J. W. Maxwell and Alfred Carlson, it was ordered that the supervisor of road district No. 8 open said road for public travel, and there being no road supervisor in this district Alfred Carlson was authorized to do so.

In the matter of the petition of H. M. Farmer for a county road, this was continued.

In the matter of the petition of the recorder of Bay City, on behalf of town of Bay City for road money, this was rejected.

Claim of Chas. Ray for hauling gravel on county road, continued.

Claims for work on road district No. 2, superintended by W. C. Morton, rejected.

Claim of Jacob Joridi for removing logs from county road, continued.

Claim of J. B. Delsman and Fred Burton, for removing logs from county road, continued.

Donaldson, C. E., claim for \$90, allowed only in the sum of \$74, for work on the Dougherty river bridge.

Claim of E. Donaldson for \$16 was allowed in claim No. 36.

In the matter of the petition of D. P. Harvey for a duplicate county warrant, it was granted.

In the matter of the petition for an extension of time to collect the taxes on the 1899 roll, it was granted, made returnable on the first Monday in May.

In the matter of a road along the line of Peter Wilson's land, known as the J. H. Nolan road, it was ordered opened, F. D. Vincent being authorized to open it.

In the matter of the change of the county road through the premises of Charles Ray on the south side of the Nes-tucca river, viewers were appointed; viz: W. A. Gage, D. T. Werschul and Geo. Nelson, to meet on the 20th of March at the house of Charles Ray at 8 o'clock.

In the matter of a road known as the Geo. T. Potet county road, it was ordered opened, and L. M. Commons is authorized to open it.

In the matter of boundaries of Fair-view voting precinct, it appearing to the court on the petition of Assessor J. S. Stephens, that it was incorrect, and it was changed as follows: viz: Beginning at the point where Trask river crosses the east line of sec. 6, tp. 2 S, R. 9 W., thence up said river to S. W. cor. of sec. 25, tp. 1 S., R. 9 W., thence east one mile, thence south one mile thence east one mile, thence north one mile, thence east three miles to S. E. corner of sec. 33, tp. 1 S, R. 8 W., thence south six miles to S. W. corner of sec. 34, tp. S, R. 8 W., thence east to east line, thence northerly along east boundary line to N. E. corner of sec. 31, tp. 2 N, R. 5 W., thence west 19 miles to the N. W. cor. of sec. 31, tp. 2 N, R. 8 W., thence south 9 miles to S. W. corner of sec. 7, tp. 1 S, R. 8 W., thence west 5 miles to N. W. corner of sec. 17, tp. 1 S, R. 9 W., thence south 4 1/2 miles, more or less to place of beginning.

In the matter of the boundary of Foley voting precinct, it appearing to the court on the petition of Assessor Stephens that it was incorrect was changed as follows: Beginning at the S. W. cor., sec 23, tp. 2 N, R. 10 W., thence east 1 mile, thence south 1 mile, thence east 24 miles to the county line to the S. E. corner of sec. 26, tp. 2 N, R. 6 W., thence Nw on county line to N. E. corner of sec. 36, tp. 3 N, R. 7 W., thence east 6 miles to county line to the S. E. corner of sec. 25, tp. 3 N, R. 6 W., thence north one mile to N. E. corner of sec. 26, tp. 3 N, R. 6 W., thence west 24 miles to the N. W. corner of sec. 30, tp. 3 N, R. 9 W., thence south 2 miles to the south east corner of sec. 36, tp. 3 N, R. 10 W. thence west one mile, thence south 2 miles to S. W. corner of sec. 23, tp. 2 N, R. 10 W., to the place of beginning.

In the matter of work on the Ben-scheidt road it was reported that subscriptions and donations had been worked out, and it appearing to the court that there is still need of more work on said road to make it good for public travel, A Benschidt was appointed to superintend the work on said road.
