The Assessment on Timber Lands.

There appears to be a disposition on the part of the officials in Columbia and Clatsop counties to raise the rate of assessment on timber lands. It may be well for the officials of Tillamook county to take into consideration the advisability of doing the same thing, for a little more revenue for the purpose of constructing roads would come in exceedingly handy to our county officials who are wrestling with the road problem. The Oregon Mist has this to say:

"It is evident that methods are soon to be inaugurated which will make capitalists or speculators, rather, weep. Most of the timber lands of the Coast counties are now owned by speculators. On these lands taxation has not been burdensome, materially enhancing the inducement to buyers to acquire larger holdings. A plan is now well under way in Clatsop county to raise the valuation of timber lands next year. The average valuation of timber land in Clatsop last year was \$1.92 an acre. The average in Columbia county last year was \$2.35, which, perhaps, was somewhat too low, but under the circumstances it was as high as it justly should be placed. The rate in Clatsop county should be raised. Capitalists have flocked there and acquired title to thousands of acres of valuable land, yet the assessment is not anywhere near as high as that paid for improved land. The timbered lands mentioned possess far greater value than the improved lands and should be compelled to pay proportionately to their real value to their owner. The rate in Clatsop county is outrageously low. Two times the amount would be too low. In 1899, twenty-eight timber syndicates owned 102,000 acres of selected timber lands in Clatsop county, the assessed valuation being \$195,000. It is the intention to assess this land at not less than \$2.50 an acre, which will increase the total assessed valuation by \$86,770, and increase the total amount of revenue by over \$3000. With this additional sum, many new roads can be constructed throughout the county districts. The matter has already been placed before the assessor of that county, who favors it, and will assess the lands at \$2.50 an acre. Even with this increase, the assessed valuation will be lower than that in neighboring counties in Oregon and Washington. The timber lands of Clatsop county are being corralled by the big syndicates, many of which own more than 5000 acres. Timber is regarded as a great speculation, and almost every acre of good land in the county has been bought."

The timber lands in Tillamook county are assessed in three different classes, the best quarter section for \$400, the next for \$300 and last for \$200.

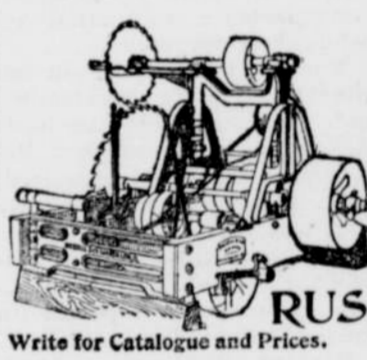
