Victory for Settlers.
Charles J. Schnabel, of Portland, was made happy by receiving a card from F. D. Monckton, Clerk of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals at San Francisco, informing him that an opinion was filed in that court on May 16 in cases 639, 640 and 641—the Oregon & California Railroad Company vs. the United States ex rel.—in which the judgment of the lower court in each case was affirmed. These cases were brought by Mr. Schnabel in the United States Court in behalf of 29 settlers on indemnity lands in this state, whose claims were filed on by the Oregon & California Railroad Company, involving, in all, 300,000 acres in the Roseburg land district. Mr. Schnabel's cause for rejoicing in this matter is that his contingent fees in the cases amount up to \$8000. The railroad company set up that not only the place limits of its grant 20 miles on each side of the O. & C. R. R. line were reserved to it, but that the indemnity lands were also reserved to it from which to complete its selections, and that no one had a right to locate on such lands until the company had completed its selection. The settlers interested in these cases located on the indemnity lands before they were set apart as such. Some of them had been there many years, and had made extensive improvements, and were waiting for the lands to be surveyed in order to file on them. The Court of Appeals has decided that these lieu or indemnity lands were not public lands and so not open to be filed on by settlers.
In the cases above mentioned, Judge Bellinger decided that the settlers on these lieu lands had a prior right to their claims, and ordered the filings of

the railroad company to be canceled. The company appealed to the Circuit Court of Appeals, which has now reversed itself and sustained Judge Bellinger's decision, and Mr. Schnabel has filed an attorney's lien on the property for his fees. By this decision the Southern Pacific Company loses its hold on 300,000 acres of land which settlers had taken up within the indemnity grant, and will have to select other lands within the indemnity limits if they can be found.
Another Canteen Witness.
The Rev. William J. Dalton, a Catholic priest and a Knight of Father Mathew, has written a strong protest to the War Department against the anti-canteen law, in which he handles the anti-canteenists without gloves. As his comments are based on observations of the conditions before and the conditions after the canteen was abolished, the essential parts of his letter are worth producing. He says:
"No one can enforce total abstinence. That is only a theory. We can restrict the liquor trade, which the canteen did, but we cannot wipe it out. I am a Knight of Father Mathew, a total abstainer, and would see every one in the world belong, but I know it is impossible, and I do not join those crusades. All the good the women want to do they undid, and all good that was being done without them they have utterly ruined. . . . I think I never saw anything that so quickly drove sober men into drunkards as the operation of this same anti-canteen law. While at Detroit I had an opportunity to see soldiers from the neighborhoods, and I never saw them so drunk.
"During the many times I have visited cities contiguous to Army posts, including Kansas City, St. Louis, Chicago and Detroit, I have watched the soldiery. I did that because I like to study the men a nation depends upon for its very life. Always I found well-behaved, sober men. Imagine my horror last week, however, to see the same men reeling drunk and next to fighting mad. It was all the canteen law. Now, instead of getting beer or wine in camp, under the observation of an officer or sentry, with some restraint upon his thirst, the soldier goes to vile dens, to be urged to drink until he has spent his last cent, and is drunk, overstays his time, and is punished. It makes deserters. What could those women have been thinking of?"
It was but a puff of wind that struck Wall street. A few cockle-shells were upset, but venturing into those speculative waters is at best risky business.
Northern Pacific has participated in a prominent way in several razzle-dazzles on Wall street. That in which Jay Cooke was wrecked in 1873 was the first, and the one in which Henry Villard was overthrown in 1883-84 was the second. The affair of last week was only a zephyr compared with the cyclones in the other instances. One of the reasons, of course, why the disturbance this time has ended quickly was that the business conditions throughout the country at present are far better than they were on the other occasions.
At the beginning of May, on a basis of 77,536,000 inhabitants in the United States, the per capita circulation was \$28.31. This, of course, is a far higher figure than has ever been reached in the past. There has been a pretty constant increase in the proportionate circulation for several years. It is nearly 33 per cent greater now than it was when Mr. Bryan was starting his reign of terror in the canvass of 1896, and it is undoubtedly twice as great as it would be if Bryan had been elected in that year or in 1900. The gold element of the circulation is the largest ingredient, and that would practically all have disappeared a few months after the inauguration if he had been elected. Still, there is a possibility that Mr. Bryan may be a candidate in 1904. He has many warm friends yet, and they are not discouraged at the defeats of 1896 and 1900. The fight for supremacy in his party between Bryan and his enemies is still to come off.—Globe Democrat.
