EDITORIAL NOTES.

It is a source of gratification to notice that quite a number of progressive persons in different parts of Oregon have been agitating the question of more woolen mills for this state.

The national government's new system of disposing of large tracts of public lands by lottery may have shocked some of the priests of the East, who have called it gambling, but it has progressed

far enough to justify the conclusion that it is an unqualified success. The same system, or something similar to it, will undoubtedly be adopted in all future openings, for the benefits vastly outweigh the possible evils.

It will be noticed that some of the owners of property along the streams in Clatsop are beginning to remonstrate against the county court leasing unnavigable streams.

Arrangements are now being made to purchase the machinery for the new daily newspaper plant to be erected in Portland.

With a view to settling a vexed question, or of leading up to its settlement, Secretary Root has called on the officers of the various Army posts for reports of the effect of the abolishment of the canteen.

There is every indication that Europe must buy more of American foodstuffs this year than last.

There are nine counties in Oregon which have a loss in school children, and Tillamook is one of them with a decrease of

less than the requirements of home consumption. The condition is even worse in Germany. These facts warrant the opinion that Europe will need our food products this year in quantities exceeding the requirements of any previous year.
