7.7 in. of Rain in Tillamook.

FOR OF THE TILLAMOOK HEADLIGHT.]
 Sir,—Inspecting your semi-annual report published in your issue of October 3rd, I find you have made one error and important mistake in the amount of rainfall gauged by me at your station, namely, in making it appear only 109 inches of rain fell during the year from September 22, 1900, to September 22nd, 1901, instead of 150.11 inches. I enclose herewith a copy of the original manuscript you will find the amount of rain from September 22, to March 21, 1901, 109.77; from March 21 to September 22, 1901, 40.34 making the annual amount 150.11.

Another column of your paper you know Tillamook County has reason to be angry because it has only 109 inches of rain for the year ending the 22nd of last month, that the amount of Tillamook is 150.11 inches. I say that if anybody is to do anything it is the old veteran weather man, Charles H. Hays, who is made a mistake at the station, while in the building of Tillamook, we have no use for irrigation machinery. Please rectify the mistake and publish this report in your issue to keep him from going to the smith shop for steel toes.

Any way, four feet of rainfall don't amount to much in Tillamook, but we'd rather be out-criticized than get a kicking from the editor's steel toes, even if he has made a mistake doubly worse by saying that the word March, when it is written last week's Headlight, is wrong. It is "last month," which is another one on the Captain. We are sorry, Captain, we cannot stand the blame for your mistake.—EDITOR.
