### CHANCE FOR HOMESTEADS.

#### Part of Grand Ronde Reservation Will be Thrown Open Soon.

There will be quite a rush for homesteads on the Grand Ronde Indian reservation next Summer, in the opinion of Lewis Shortridge, a merchant of Dolph, Tillamook County, who, with his daughter, is registered at the Perkins. "That portion of the reserve not allotted to the Indians is to be purchased from them by the Government at \$10 an acre, and is very likely to be thrown open to settlement in July next," said Mr. Shortridge yesterday, "and there are quite a number of tracts that can be transformed into good homes. The big timber was all destroyed by fire as early as the year 1842, and so there will be no inducement for timber land hunters, but parties desiring to go into the business of dairying or stockraising can find desirable localities there. There are about 90,000 acres in the reservation, and about one-half of the tract will be absorbed by Indians, of whom there are now 350. The Government donates 80 acres to each man, woman and child, and the remainder will probably be thrown open to the whites, under the homestead law, which allows each citizen 160 acres free, after residence and improvement.

"The Indians are now left pretty well to themselves, so far as the paternal care of the Government is concerned, and the only agents of Uncle Sam in the reserve are a school teacher and a doctor. A few very old Indians are helped in the matter of provisions, medicine and clothing, but the younger ones have to rustle for themselves. Most of them are only concerned about the present and so do not try to get ahead much. They have very good houses as a general thing, but the premises are run down and bespeak a general air of shiftlessness not found in a white community.

"A good toll road leads into the country from Sheridan, Yamhill County, and the extension of a railroad from some point on the West Side would bring it within a few hours of Portland, where a good market exists for all that we raise. Although not a grain-raising county, money is very plentiful in Tillamook, as the dairymen and lumbermen have done well in the past few years. We buy all our flour from Yamhill County, however, and we haven't a gristmill in all Tillamook."—Oregonian.
