A Miraculous Escape.

TACOMA, Jan. 11.—Seldom, if ever, does maritime history record a more thrilling experience or a more miraculous escape from certain destruction than that which was encountered by the three-masted British bark *Caithness* shire, Captain Furneaux, which arrived yesterday.

Driven on the rocky Vancouver shore last Tuesday night in a gale, with but 15 fathoms of water beneath her, in the teeth of a furious wind and heavy sea, both of her anchors were lost, with 200 fathoms of chain. Helpless and with shoaling water increasing, Captain Furneaux and his crew expected to see the vessel driven on the shore, and so certain were they of her fate that the small boats were lowered and hurried preparations made to take to them. Almost within an instant, however, the wind shifted and began to blow from the northwest. Sail was clapped on to the *Caithness* shire and she was driven clear of shore, anchorless, but safe. Seldom so said escapes occur. "It was a miracle," said Captain Furneaux, "and but for the miracle she would be piled up on the Vancouver shore to-day instead of being safely in harbor."

Two dollars and a quarter net per box is the price *Oswell Bros.*, of Central Point Jackson County, received for a carload of Oregon Newtowns sold in the London market a day or two before Christmas. Another car, sold a few days later, when the market was a little off, brought \$1 75 net. More of the same apples are now in London, and returns are expected at any time.

Edward Lampre, representing the Panama Canal Company, appeared before the senate committee on inter-oceanic canals in obedience to a summons to testify concerning an offer of his company to sell its property and franchise to the United States. M. Jules Bouefve of the French embassy also was present. The meeting was held behind closed doors. M. Lampre was questioned at length by members of the committee. He said the offer at \$40,000,000 had been made in good faith and his company way able to deliver the goods.

A man with his heart on the right side instead of the left has just been discovered by the Pension Board of this city. The man is George W. Hurst, of Lexington, a veteran of the Civil War, who recently applied for a pension. Hurst says that he has never experienced any discomfort or inconvenience as a result of this unusual location of his heart. The pulsations are as even as those of an ordinary man of his age, and there appears to be nothing unusual about the heart except its location.
