An Ordinance to provide for the publication of ordinances...

Section 1.—That the city recorder shall cause each ordinance hereafter passed by the common council to be published in full in one issue of a weekly newspaper published in Tillamook City...

Section 2.—That the city recorder shall see that all ordinances are numbered and filed in his office in consecutive order, convenient for ready reference...

Section 3.—All ordinances now in force and hereafter passed shall be recorded by the city recorder in a substantial and permanent record book...

Section 4.—Ordinance No. 7 and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

An Ordinance to restrain and prohibit intoxication, fighting and quarrelling and unlawful or indecent act or practice...

Section 1.—If any person shall within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, be upon any street, alley or other public place in a condition of intoxication...

Section 2.—If any person or persons within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, shall arrange or attempt to arrange, or offer to arrange or engage in or offer to engage in any fight or quarrel...

Section 3.—If any person shall willfully disturb or break up any public meeting or assembly of people other than those mentioned in section four of this ordinance...

Section 4.—If any person shall within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, willfully disturb, in erupt or disquiet any assembly or congregation of people met for the purpose of worship...

Section 5.—If any person shall willfully disturb or break up any public meeting or assembly of people other than those mentioned in section four of this ordinance...

Section 6.—Ordinance No. 73, and all other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ENDORSEMENT. Ordinance No. 130.

An Ordinance to prevent and restrain the disturbance of meetings, and any riot, noise, disturbance or disorderly assembly in any street, house or place...

Section 1.—Any use of force or violence or any threat to use force or violence, if accompanied by immediate power of execution, by three or more persons acting together, and without authority of law, is riot, and any person guilty of participating in any riot in any street, house or place within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars and costs...

Section 2.—Any person making or creating any unnecessary noise or any disturbance or taking part in, or abetting any disorderly assembly in any street, house or place within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars and costs...

Section 3.—If any person within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, shall willfully ride or drive any horse, mule or other animal upon any sidewalk therein, or shall willfully ride or drive any horse or mule through any street thereof, at a greater speed than six miles an hour, upon conviction thereof such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars and costs...

Section 4.—If any person shall within the corporate limits of Tillamook City, Oregon, willfully disturb, in erupt or disquiet any assembly or congregation of people met for the purpose of worship, whether in the house or open air, either by uttering any profane discourse, or indecent act, or making any unnecessary noise within the place where such meeting is held, or so near to it as to disturb the order and solemnity thereof, such person upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars and costs nor more than twenty-five dollars and costs...

Section 5.—If any person shall willfully disturb or break up any public meeting or assembly of people other than those mentioned in section four of this ordinance lawfully met for lawful purposes, whether such meeting or assembly be met in a house or in the open air, such person upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars and costs nor more than twenty-five dollars and costs...

Section 6.—Ordinance No. 73, and all other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
