Protection of Rural Delivery.

The action of the house of representatives in defeating the proposal to place rural free mail delivery under the contract system is very generally approved.

There is no reason to doubt that the bill will become law in about the shape it passed the house and that the result of its operation will be satisfactory to the people who are most interested in this legislation.

A National Incorporation Law.

The question of the supervision and regulation of the combinations engaged in interstate commerce is a difficult one, but it is a question the solution of which is urgently demanded and its public discussion should be earnest maintained until it is solved.

Mr. Dill expressed the opinion that we can look for no effective publicity—no effective restriction or regulation of corporate power—under a diverse and systematically opposed state legislation, therefore public opinion formulated into statutes, to be of the highest efficiency and to be freed from evils of subordination, even of prostitution, must be uniform among all the states and national in extent.

Under such a law as suggested the national corporation should be subject to national supervision and examination and there should be required at least "private publicity," which Mr. Dill believes would result in "public publicity."

This suggestion of one who has had much experience in the organization of great corporations and is regarded as an expert in the matter, certainly merits consideration. If a national incorporation law be practicable and constitutional it might remedy many of the difficulties in dealing with the great combinations.

Father Schell's Spite Work.

In the Oregonian's telegraphic news from Washington on Friday, it contains an item which is nothing more or less than spite work on the part of Father Joseph Schell.

"Father Joseph Schell, of St. Louis, Or., today concluded a series of interviews with the Assistant Secretary of the Interior, relative to 190 alleged fraudulent timber entries in Tillamook County, which are said to have been made by Oregon and Washington farmers, under contract to relinquish the lands to an Eastern company.
