General News of Interest.

Cecil Rhodes, the uncrowned King of South Africa, died last week. The Historic battle of Buzaco, Portugal where the Duke of Wellington (September 27, 1810) repulsed the French Army, commanded by Marshal Massena, has been turned into golf links for the benefit of visitors.

The Minnesota Dairy and Food Department scored its first conviction under the pure-food law.

Chairman Sulloway, of the House committee on invalid pensions, is preparing a report on the bill granting a pension of \$5000 annually to the widow of President McKinley, and will present it probably this week.

Richard Croker, who has gone into the dairy business on a large scale, called a meeting of the farmers of the Wantage district, which offered them London prices for all milk delivered at the Mount-House Creamery, says a dispatch to the World from Wantage, England.

Commissioner of Pensions Evans has placed his resignation in the hands of the president. It will not take effect until some important position in the diplomatic service is found for him.

Colonel James G. Stowe, ex-United States Consul-General at Cape Town, South Africa, in an address, said that he had returned to this country with the intention of writing and publishing a book on the South African war, but that he had been requested not to do so by John Hay, Secretary of State, and that he had therefore given up the project at least for the present.

A suffrage plan has been finally agreed upon by the constitutional convention of Virginia, under which the negro vote will be practically eliminated. It provides that voters shall pay a poll tax of \$1.50; shall be able to read or understand when the constitution of the state is read to them, and shall be able to make application for the right to register in their own handwriting, in the presence of the registrars.

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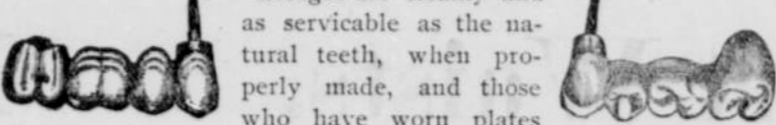
