Notice is hereby given that the School Directors of School District No. 9, Tillamook County, Oregon, will receive sealed bids for the construction of a new school building of four rooms to be joined to and communicating with the present school building in said district, said four rooms to be constructed in conformity to the present school building and to be of the same dimensions and finished in the same way; said building to have a foundation of cedar blocks resting on concrete and gravel and the interior arrangement and division of the same to be in conformity to the present building, including first class brick flues and stairway. Said building is to be constructed of first class material in a thoroughly workmanlike manner and to be painted inside and outside with at least two coats of pure lead and oil. The roof is to be made of cedar shingles and to be painted with at least two coats of first class roof paint. Windows and doors to be in conformity to those of the present building. All lumber used in said building to be first class fir lumber. Each bidder will be required to furnish with his bid detailed specifications of the work and material covered by such bid. The said School Board reserves the right to make modifications in said specifications in the accepted bid, any increase or decrease of cost to be allowed. The bid must be sealed and addressed to Thos. Coates, Clerk of School District No. 9, Tillamook City, Oregon, and bids will be opened on Saturday, June 21st at nine o'clock a. m. at a meeting of said Board to be held at the office of B. L. Eddy, Tillamook City, Oregon. The said School Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids and will require from the successful bidder a good and sufficient bond with surety in the amount of his bid, conditioned that said bidder will, if awarded the contract for said work, finish and complete the same in a first class and workmanlike manner not later than September 15, 1902. The said School Board will also receive at the same time and in the same manner sealed bids for labor and material for the repair of the present school building in said district, such repairs to consist of a renewal of the foundation of said building by placing sound cedar blocks on concrete and gravel and by renewing any defective sills or joists and also to include the painting of the roof of said building with two coats of first class roof paint; also to include the taking up of the old floors and laying of new floors in the hallways, downstairs and upstairs, and putting in new steps in the stairway; also to include the painting of said building with pure lead and oil, two coats outside and one coat inside; also to include the changing of the door room from its present location in the downstairs room in the west end of said building to the opposite side of the room; also to include the painting of the roof of said building with two coats of first class roof paint; also to include repairs of the bellry so as to make the same watertight.
