Obituary Notice.

The remains of the late B. N. Daniel reach here Monday, and were brought over the Wilson river road. Beverly N. Daniel, son of B. R. and Sarah A. Daniel, was born in Randolph County, Mo., April 10, 1857. He died at Stillwater, Ok., of heart failure, Aug. 31, 1902, and was, therefore, 45 years, 4 months and 15 days of age at the time of his death. The deceased emigrated to Tillamook county with his parents in 1865, where he remained until he attained his majority, at which time or a little later he engaged in business with J. D. Edwards at North Yamhill. He was married to Katherine E. Maddox on September 20, 1886, to them were born two daughters, Theo and Nona E. Daniel, who, together with his widow, survive him. Besides those nearer ones, he leaves in life a mother, Mrs. Sarah A. Daniel, and brothers and sisters as follows: Mrs. F. M. Lamb, of South Prairie; Mrs. J. D. Wallace, of Tillamook; A. C. Daniel, of Nehalem; Mrs. J. N. McCune, of Ashland; and Mrs. Charles Ooley, of Portland. Mr. Daniel removed from North Yamhill about four years ago to Eastern Oregon. Later on to Chicago, where, after a residence of some months, removed to Stillwater, Ok., where he was residing at the time of his decease. His remains were embalmed and shipped to his old home in Tillamook county for enternment, accompanied by his bereaved family.

B. N. Daniel was familiarly known among his many friends as "Newt," and was an industrious, temperate, honorable citizen and business man. He leaves many friends who deplore his death. The remains were buried at the Odd-fellows cemetery on Tuesday, the pall bearers being a number of old friends in Tillamook. The religious services being held in the M. E. Church, conducted by Rev. G. Sykes, and attended by a large number of sympathizing friends.
