The court designed the Tillamook Headlight and Herald as the county news papers, and entered into an agreement with them to publish the court proceedings and official notices at a lump sum of \$150 for 12 months.

Report of John Theiler was approved. There being a vacancy as Supervisor in district No. 4, caused by the death of P. F. Ducham, D. A. Simmons was appointed to fill the vacancy.

The statement of the County Treasurer was approved.

The report of W. J. Himes was approved; also that of M. H. Ripley.

B. F. Archer applied for county aid and was allowed \$1 50 per week until otherwise ordered.

In the matter of the petition of the Odd fellows Lodge of Bay City, to vacate a certain county road, it was so ordered.

The claim of Harley Poland for \$15 for plow was continued.

The claim of the Tillamook Logging Co. for \$32 for cable was continued.

The claim of Hicks & Nelson, for \$8 worth of merchandise, furnished road dist. No. 4 was continued.

Claim of T. R. Wilson for \$2.50 for timber, used in the construction of the Little Nestucca bridge, was continued.

The petition for the return of money belonging to the Astoria Co., was agreed to and \$40.28 was ordered refunded.

Report of J. W. Wallace of the collection of poll taxes, the report was approved.

The petition of L. Parrish for the establishment of a county road, was accepted and viewers appointed, viz, Joseph Nevins, Peter Nelson, and Miles Warren, with F. L. Sappington as surveyor to meet on April 10.

The petition of Wm. G. Gosslin for the cancellation of assessment of certain lands, the sales were ordered cancelled.
