In the matter of the petition of H. Schollmeyer for a location of a county road, the same was granted, and H. H. Tubesing, Fred Zaddach and Fred Miller were appointed viewers and F. L. Sappington surveyor, to meet on May 25 at the house of Henry Tohl.

LITTLE NESTUCCA TOLL RATES.

The application of The Little Nestucca Wagon Road Company for the establishment of rates of toll on its wagon road were fixed as follows:

Each four wheeled vehicle. \$1 00

Each two wheeled vehicle. 50

Each saddle or pack horse. 25

Each head of loose stock. 10

Each head of sheep or hogs. 2 1/2

It was ordered that all persons living upon the line shall be permitted to travel over the road and pass through the gate at one-half rates of toll. This rate of toll was established upon the condition that the company construct a substantial bridge across the Little Nestucca river on said road, at the Warner ford, during the season of 1903, and otherwise repair and put road in good condition.

The petition of S. P. Svenson, for a saloon license in Garibaldi precinct was granted.

HIG NESTUCCA TOLL RATES.

The Court fixed the rate of toll on the Big Nestucca Toll Road as follows:

Each four wheeled vehicle. \$1.00.

Each two wheeled vehicle. 50.

Each saddle pack horse. 25.

Each head of loose stock. 10.

Each head of hogs or sheep. 2 1/2

All persons living on the toll line are permitted to travel the road and pass through the gate at one half of the rate of toll. The rate of toll was granted on the condition that the company expend 40 per cent of the receipts of toll on the road in substantial improvements.

In the matter of taxes upon mortgage on lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, of sec. 18, tp 3 N, R. 10 W, for year 1890, a tax redemption certificate was ordered issued.

The claim of N. G. Boquist was reconsidered and allowed in the sum of \$2.70 for 54 loads of pit gravel in dist. 5.

The claim of I. F. Larson, for \$44 50, for merchandise in dist. 6, was allowed.

WILSON RIVER TOLL RATES.

The court fixed the rate of toll on the Wilson River Toll road as follows:

Each vehicle with two horses. \$1.50.

Each vehicle with four horses. 2.00.

Each vehicle with one horse. 1.00.

Each head of cattle or horse driven loose. 13 1/2.

Each goat, sheep or hog. 5.

Each horse, with rider. 50.

Each traveler on a bicycle. 25.

Road petition of W. D. Gladwell was accepted and W. T. West, M. Carl and A. Griest were appointed viewers and F. L. Sappington surveyor to meet at John Borba's on May 18.

Road petition of Frank Worthington was continued until such time as the petitioners shall have the road opened, and then the court will accept deed for the same and declare it a county road.

Petition of Henry Hellebyck for rebate on taxes was rejected.

The Chinese Minister called upon Secretary Hay and discussed the Manchurian situation. There is good reason to believe that the negotiations have taken a more favorable turn, and that the Russian coup which was expected has either been abandoned or been indefinitely postponed. It is understood that this involves no retreat on the part of the Russian government from any position officially taken.

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
