Dairy Strippings.

The celebrated Holstein cow, Pegis Inks, recently sold for \$1,000.

Experts have figured out that 20 per cent of the butter was lost by the gravity process. The loss on one good cow would be forty pounds a year, which at 20 cents a pound, would be \$8 per year.

One of the hands of a dairy school urges his patrons to sow a patch of Canada peas and oats to feed the cows that supply the station with milk when the pastures are short, saying that the forage from such a sowing would furnish the cows with a perfect ration.

Observers and experimenters believe that one fourth of the cows in the country are boarders, and nearly one-fourth more barely pay expenses—leaving their owners no profit. Would it not be a matter of ordinary business prudence for the owners of cows to test their herds, only thus can they tell the unprofitable cow and get rid of them as soon as possible. There would be more made if the boarders were conspicuous by their absence.

Secretary Ellis of the Missouri State Board says they have reduced milking to a science at the experiment station. The experiments run over a period of nine months. What is known as the Hegelund method of manipulating the udders was practiced after the milk had been drawn. The results of the tests was that only 38 cents was made on nine cows in the two daily milkings. The whole hand was the best to use, leaving the thumbs turned out.

Prof. G. L. McKay of Iowa Agricultural college says that centralized creamery plant have an advantage over the small creameries in the fact that they can control the overrun. Two per cent more moisture will pay the running expense often of the large creameries and the skilled buttermakers that these creameries keep can and do, make larger overrun than the small factories. Some of the highest scoring butter of the national contest had considerable moisture in it.

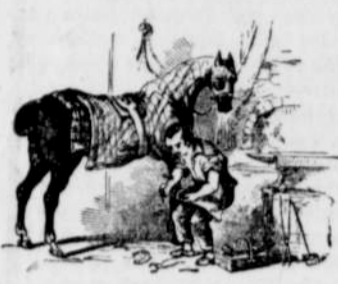
