The Oddfellows fittingly celebrated the 85th anniversary of the order in the United State on Tuesday evening, when there was a good attendance and a very pleasant evening was participated in by all present. Previous to a bountiful supper served by the Rebekas, which is

always a special feature on these occasions, a short program was rendered, which included a solo by Miss Jenkins, remarks by Messrs. T. B. Hadley and Claude Thayer; recitation, "When Papa rode the Goat," by Roswell Heins, and songs by Miss Pickel.

Geo. T. Potet, who was in the city on Saturday attending the socialist convention, was circulating a petition to be presented to District Attorney Hart, who had promised to take legal proceedings in the matter: "We, the undersigned residents of Tillamook county beg leave to call your attention to the very unsatisfactory condition of the Little Nestucca toll road. The owners of this road have been collecting toll for the past 23 years, and although the road is only eight miles long, it is in a deplorable condition the greater part of the year and unfit for travel. The law requirements in the building of toll roads is utterly disregarded. We, therefore, respectfully petition you to take such action as you think proper to suspend the right of owners to said road to collect toll until such time as they shall have complied with the law in regard to the building of toll roads."

The Seante committee on public lands on Monday, by a tie vote, put the finishing touches upon the prospect of securing reforms in the land laws at this session. The bill to repeal the desert land act and the commutation clause of the homestead act was defeated by a vote of seven to seven, Senator Fulton voting against the repeal. He contends these laws are not conducive to fraud, but on the contrary, if properly enforced, will work to the benefit of bona fide settlers. The vote kills the bill for the next, as well as the present session.
