We are not surprised to hear that the county clerk-elect will appoint a lady as his deputy after chasing school marms for nearly six years as county superintendent.

As there appears to be a desire to have the usual Fourth of July celebration in this city, and as the men appear to be indifferent, we move, as this is leap year, that the ladies take hold.

"I'm not altogether sorry that Mr. Eddy is defeated, for we'll continue to have a good attorney in the city," was the remark of one of our citizens when it was heard that Mr. Eddy was defeated.

The republicans at Nehalem did not show a very magnanimous spirit Monday. The entire county gave her favored son a good vote and elected him, but in return for this the Nehalemites did not do a thing but knife the ticket.

If Prof. Wiley makes as successful a superintendent as the present incumbent he will do well. An opportunity is now before him, and it rests entirely with himself what his reputation will be after filing the office for a few years.

If an editor does not take a stand on one side or the other of the political fence, he is called weak-kneed and has no opinions; if he is a partisan and takes a stand for a party, then he is accused of being a political boss and being a tool in the hands of others.

What kind of a political trick was it that Blaine, the hotbed of prohibition, got into on Monday? It gave Coates 36 votes and Lamb 15 votes. There must be some empty bottles knocking about that burg to have brought about that change in sentiment.

What with the saloons, dissatisfied republicans, prohibitionists, socialists and democrats fighting the republican party, together with the personal animus and religious prejudice that was created against three or four of the candidates, it is a source of gratification that the ticket got through as well as it did.

It is now in order for the democrats to

pass a vote of thanks to those who went into the republican primaries and convention and ended up with working and voting with the democrats. And at the same time republicans will not soon forget this tendency of some people to flop, especially if they should want any political favors from the republican party.

The political parties in Tillamook had better quit putting up local tickets in the future if they are going to knife the candidates directly they leave a political convention. It may be before another election that republicans, if they are republicans, will take a tumble to themselves and fall into line now that they see that the democrats are crowing over them.

The HEADLIGHT man found the door of his office draped with crape on Wednesday. It would have looked better if they had draped the county and their own doors with crape for the injury they have done Tillamook county. The result of the election is a direct blow at the county and those who have interested themselves in its development. If the mugwumps want to rejoice over that, let them.

The election is over. Tillamook continues to be republican on national issues, but in local affairs the republican party went to pieces on account of internal strife, brought about by the minority not being willing to abide by the will of the majority. The democrats took advantage of that, so the local fight was again turned into personalities and personal animosities, which is gradually taking the county offices from the republicans and turning them over to their opponents.

There is one thing connected with this election which the HEADLIGHT did, although it had nothing whatever to do with the republican primaries and convention, it gave the entire republican ticket its support, so no one can say hereafter that it flunked on either of the candidates as did those who went into the primaries and convention and nominated the candidates. That is the proper way to run politics, as the republicans will find out after allowing themselves to be shot to pieces a few more times on account of making the fight a personal and not a political one.

Perhaps few people realize it, but in turning Sheriff Stanley down on Monday it is plain to see that he has been made the victim of circumstances over which he had no control or knowledge, and for that reason we feel sorry for him, for we still believe he was entitled to the votes of his party. To knife him the way he was, we believe upon calm reflection a number of republicans will come to the conclusion that they have done him an injustice because they were laboring under wrong impressions about him, and

which were magnified by those who opposed him.

The whiskey ring is to a large extent responsible for the defeat of Mr. Eddy. A large number of our citizens will not forget this fact when a vote is taken on prohibition. It will be noticed that the whiskey ring has been fighting candidates who did not frequent saloons for years. It also fought Lamb and Stanley. And what with the gambling and allowing minors to frequent saloons, perhaps that is the reason there was such a large vote in the county. We do not think we are a prohibition crank, nor are we a saloon crank, but it is plain to see that the people of this county are not well pleased with the whiskey ring, and the defeat of Mr. Eddy is going to bring about a much stronger sentiment against the whiskey ring. It is the opinion of T. B. Handley that when a vote is taken, Tillamook county will vote to put the saloons out of business.

The vote that was cast in Tillamook for Mr. Eddy was disappointing to the HEADLIGHT and a large number of our best citizens. It shows that a majority of the people of this county are ungrateful to Mr. Eddy for the service he has rendered the county and state, and that on account the people have not shown a very magnanimous spirit. It is a victory, however for Mr. Eddy's personal and venomous enemies, being the first time that the rule or ruin faction has got the best of him in politics. But there is one redeeming feature, for Mr. Eddy will remain in Tillamook and the people will have the benefit of his advice. This is but a small set back to Mr. Eddy's political career, for as a progressive and aggressive person, those who have been trying to pull him down for years and besmirch his character and reputation will find that they have gained but a temporary advantage over him.

George F. Phillips, who won renown as engineer of the collier Merrimac, sunk by Hobson at the mouth of Santiago's harbor, died at his home in Cambridgeport, Mass. Phillips enlisted in the Navy as a machinist at the outbreak of the Spanish-American War. When Hobson called for volunteers to sink the collier, Phillips offered his services. He remained at the engine of the Merrimac and at great personal danger, reversed his engines under a storm of shells, then opened the sea valves, flooded the ship and made his way to the deck while the vessel was sinking. After the war he was transferred to Philippine waters. His death was due to Bright's disease.
