Adulteration of Cod Liver Oil.

Writing from Christiania, Norway, the American consul general discusses the practice of adding to cod liver oil that which is obtained from the livers of other fishes, like the haddock, ling, cusk and coalfish. In winter, it is said, none of these other fish approach the Norwegian coasts, and hence there is little danger of any admixture being made. If the adulteration does not exceed ten per cent it is hard to detect.

The genuine medicinal cod liver oil is of a light amber color; the odor is slight. The adulteration of cod liver oil is said to have been unknown, at least in Norway, prior to the last couple of years. Oil from coalfish brought very moderate prices in the Lofoten Islands prior to 1903, but that year it was in great demand by buyers from Aalesund and Bergen, who paid at one time \$40 per barrel for the refined article. The oil of cusk has been refined in prior years also, but it was in much greater demand in 1903 than formerly, bringing as high as \$64 per barrel. These oils are refined in the Lofoten Islands, mostly in the summer season, and the genuine cod liver oil in the winter.

Russia will not heed the British representations in regard to the action of the Russian Government in declaring rice and other foodstuffs to be contraband of war. The Russian position in relation to foodstuffs being contraband was announced by the Associated Press when the declaration was issued. It covers only full cargoes, destined for Japan, where the assumption is that they are designed for the use of the enemy's army. In effect the Novoe Vremya contends that Russia's position is rather analogous to Great Britain's during the Boer War, notwithstanding Great Britain's protest against foodstuffs being declared contraband at the time of the Franco-Chinese war in 1885 and the Japanese-Chinese war.

Worthless dogs are the poorest kind of live stock that a farmer can own. Every year there are lawsuits or neighborhood quarrels in nearly every community which originated from the depredations of some mongrel that is not worth his brand. A good dog, when properly trained, may be of some use to his master and many of them render no little assistance. Of course, dogs of that variety sometimes run amuck and chase the neighbors' sheep or cattle and kill their chickens, but it is more often the worthless cur that causes trouble of that kind. Along with the improvement that is going on in breeding cattle, hogs and sheep it would be well for owners of dogs to kill off their present stock and make a fresh start or else quit the business entirely. Such a procedure might be hard on lawyers, but it would very materially increase the peace and happiness of all concerned.

What is regarded as the most crushing blow trade unionism has received in Rochester is the refusal of J. Rothschild & Co. to renew their agreement with the United Garmentworkers of America. This action leaves the organization with a single factory of importance in that city. The eight-hour working day is now a thing of the past, as all of the great clothing houses have gone back to the nine-hour system. The employees of the Rothschild factory have decided to remain loyal to the firm.

At Lexington, Ky., Police Judge J. Riley revived the old whipping-post regime when he sentenced Simon Scenerre, a 15 year-old negro lad, to be whipped in the public square. Scenerre had struck a white boy. The court decreed that the boy's mother take the boy to the public square and give him 20 lashes with a buggy whip. The mother, in the presence of a large crowd, administered the punishment as directed. This is the first time such an incident has been witnessed in Kentucky since the Civil War.
