Commissioners in Session.

The Board of County Commissioners, composed of County Judge Conder and Commissioners Bodyfelt and Loerpabel, convened on Wednesday and transacted the following business:  
A. B. Pollard was granted a license to operate a ferry for the term of one year on the Nestucca river, where the same is crossed by the county road at the town of Woods, in Union precinct. The license was fixed at \$5.00 and that Pollard give an undertaking in the sum of \$250.00, and that the rates of fare were fixed as follows:  
For each foot passenger 5c.  
For each horseman 10c.  
For each head of loose stock 10c.  
For each single buggy 15c.  
For each double team and vehicle 25c.

Fourteen persons were killed and nearly a score injured in a five-story double tenement in Attorney street, New York, early Sunday morning. The dead include four women, one man and nine children, ranging in age from 3 months to twelve months. Many of the injured were taken to hospitals, and it is thought that several will die. Among the injured were five firemen who were in a fourth-floor balcony when it fell with them. The small number of men among the killed and injured was due to the fact that most of the men who lived in the buildings, following the Attorney-street custom in hot weather, were asleep on the roof, while but few of the women and children were there.
