A. D. Puter did, on 21 on March 9, 1902, pay to John H. Beef Trust Inquiry.

It is stated that the powers given the commissioner of corporations under the publicity clause of the act establishing the Department of Commerce and Labor are to be put to the test first against the Beef trust. The law confers upon the commissioner power and authority to make investigation into the organization. conduct and management of the business of any corporation, joint stock company or any corporate combination engaged in interstate commerce. It is said that Commissioner Garfield, of the bureau of corporations, will go in person to Chicago, Kansas City and other points where information can be obtained directly from members of the corporations in the beef combine and will set up a court of inquiry before which witnesses will be summoned and questioned. The commissioner is not only empowered, but commanded to exercise the powers conferred upon him for subpoening witnesses, compelling the attendance and the testimony of witnesses and the production of books and papers and all documentary evidence.

It is expected, according to a Washington report, that the inquiry will produce a commotion among those who are the prime actors in the combine and the fullest publicity will follow every statement they make. It is said to be the belief in administration circles that if the members of the trust should divulge the secret compacts on which their monopoly rests the publicity principle will accomplish the downfall and complete destruction of the trust system of controlling the meat trade. The public will learn with satisfaction of the determina tion of the bureau of corporations to institute a vigorous and thorough investigation of what is generally regarded as one of the most rapacious of monopolies and will hope that its methods may be fully disclosed. It is understood that the authorities have sufficient data to justify the investigation.
