Schell beaten by Saloon Keepers.

SPDX CITY, Ia., April 13.—Injuries which may prove fatal were inflicted on the Rev. Father Joseph Schell, at Dakota City, Neb., to-day, by two saloon keepers, who assaulted him because of his activity in protecting the Indians of the Winnebago Reservation from the extractions of traders, speculators and loan sharks.

The saloon keepers, Harry Russell and Louis Lambert, approached Father Schell in a lively stable. Lambert struck the priest, who was not looking, a powerful blow on the jaw, knocking him down.
