

Editorial Snap Shots.

What will land be worth in Tillamook county if the boring for oil, which is now underweigh, strikes a "gusher"?

Everybody in the county is in hopes that the enterprise and perseverance of those who are now boring for oil in Tillamook will be rewarded by striking a good "gusher." And there are prospects of doing so.

Several of the parties who are known to have sold liquor have taken their departure from the city. That may be a good move on their part to get out of the way, but a bad thing for the county to allow them to slip out when there were prospects of big fines in sight. But what is the county or the government going to do with those who violated the law and still remain in the city?

The kid who is running the newspaper at Cloverdale might ask ex-Commissioner C. Ray, who rightly objected to the "graft," if it was not the Signal man who "grafted" the county 30c. a line for publish the delinquent tax list when he was commissioner, the highest figure ever paid for publishing a tax list. Because the Signal man was up against competition and could not elect county officials he could "graft" he pulled his freight. We have no objection to criticism, if it is fair and truthful, but we do object to the kid disgracing himself so early in his newspaper career by publishing that which is not true about the Headlight man.

There is a strong sentiment in favor of the county court building a bridge across the south fork of the Nehalem river. Will the court, which meets next month, decide to construct this long felt want and urgent improvement, or will it still procrastinate? It is up to Commissioner Loerpabel. If he comes down from Nehalem determined to make a strong fight for a bridge, he can rest assured that he has the public to back him. But we do not think that the county court will put itself in the unpopular predicament of opposing Commissioner Loerpabel's effort to secure a bridge for the south fork of the Nehalem river. Watch Nehalem grow—when the bridge is built.

It looks as though there will be one, if not more aspirants, for congress in every county in this district with the exception of Tillamook. Under these conditions, with the direct primary law, small counties like Tillamook stand very small prospects of getting their favored sons on the state or district republican tickets, for Multnomah and Marion counties will be the big toads in the political puddle in future, so it will be the Portland "ring," politicians vs. the Salem "ring" politicians who will be sparring from now on to control the republican party, yet we are told that the direct primary law will take the control out of the hands of the politicians and political bosses. We hope that it may, but we do not believe that it will.

It is to be hoped, now that the Hadley Lumber Company is incorporated and ready to do business on a fairly large scale, that it will induce some of the timbermen and others to embark in the lumber business. Once a good start is made, and more saw mills the better it will be for those who are running them, it will not be much trouble to obtain schooners now that there is a tow boat on the bay ready for service at any time. Heretofore this was a great drawback to the port and enough to cripple any saw mill, therefore, with brighter prospects in view for the future, it is to be hoped that with the new enterprise that is now put into the lumber industry that the Hadley Lumber Company will be able to lift it out of its long stagnation and be the means of starting up other saw mills. And then watch Tillamook grow!

Tillamook is the banner dairy county of Oregon, and it should strive to retain that honor. However, it is doubtful whether

it will be able to do so in face of the changed conditions which scientific farming is bringing about in the irrigated districts of Eastern Oregon, where they will be able to raise two and three crops of alfalfa every year. All of the experiment stations claim that alfalfa is the best fodder for milch cows. How, then, is Tillamook dairymen going to compete with the irrigated districts of Eastern Oregon, where enormous crops of the best and cheapest feed can be raised? Meadows of yellow weed will never be able to, and the dairymen in this county who fail to bestir themselves to improve their meadows with permanent grasses will soon find themselves lagging behind in this age of progress and scientific dairying. Tillamook county has made wonderful strides in dairying, and it has prided itself on being able to raise an abundance of cheap feed and without dairymen having to buy mill feed, but this county will have competition in the near future, which may seriously affect the price of butter and cheese. Whatever benefits irrigation may bring to Eastern Oregon it will never be able to obtain the ideal dairying weather of Tillamook county.

Poor Rollie has again become the "medium" for the gamblers who ran gambling joints in this city and who robbed citizens and deprived homes of comforts by their system of gambling. It was the voters of Tillamook, who saw what the low down saloon dives and gambling joints were doing who put them out of business by their votes—not the Headlight man. And of the 566 voters who voted for local option not more than 50 were prohibitionists, but citizens and fathers of families who saw that something had to be done with these law breakers and "grafter" who ran things with high hand and who made citizens drunk and then robbed them at the gambling tables. That is the kind of men, who, having no one else to jump on, jumps onto the Headlight man and blames him for "knocking" the gambling joint proprietors out of their "graft." And poor Rollie is soft and green enough to allow himself to become the "medium" for that kind of gambling "grafter" to "roast" the Headlight man, for Rollie has it in for the 566 voters who voted for local option, and like the gamblers, he has not the courage to attack the voters who put the law into effect, but bangs away at the Headlight man every time he can get someone else to load his "pop gun" for him. What does Rollie think of a man, a gambling "grafter" we should have said, who, ordering liquor and other articles from wholesale dealers, disposes of it in his saloon gambling dive, pockets the money and then takes a short cut through the bankruptcy court and pays his creditors, perhaps not 25c. on the dollar? It is a fact also that of the five bankruptcy cases in Tillamook in recent years four of them were saloons with gambling dives in connection, and it is just as well to mention that C. A. Vogler was one of those who went into bankruptcy and deprived the wholesale liquor dealers of money that rightly belonged to them, and it was gambling joints like that which Vogler and others conducted which, as every sane and fair minded persons will admit, was the real cause of the county going dry—not the Headlight man. We predicted what would take place some few years ago if the saloon keepers would not comply with the law and officials would not enforce it. If the Headlight man is to be made the "scape goat" for those who voted for local option, he can stand it and smile at the silly things the gambling "grafter" are publishing about him, and if we are compelled to come back at them they must blame themselves. Now, Rollie, tell us what you think of the gambling "grafter" who are using your sheet to roast the Headlight man, and what do you think of the "grafter" you are up against yourself?

Because the dealers are constant advertisers. Their names are constantly before the public. They believe in advertising and by continually patronizing printer's ink, their names have become familiar with every household in the section from which their trade is drawn.

The secret of success in advertising rests largely with the advertiser. Keep your name before the public whose business acquaintance you must have. Do this and you will sell your goods.

BUILDS OWN HOME.

Plucky Woman Constructs House to Live In at Auburn, N. Y.

Having Finished the House Itself, She Is Sinking a Well in Her Kitchen and Has Yet to Build a Barn.

Without the aid of any one Mrs. James Place, an elderly woman, has built a house at Auburn, N. Y. There are three rooms below stairs and two above. She now occupies it with her husband, who is a wounded veteran of the civil war.

"My husband is not strong, and for years hasn't been able to do hard work," she said. "We needed a permanent home, but we saw no way of having one until I went at it myself. We bought this building lot in West Auburn and I put up the house. It contains 3,000 feet of lumber, and by the time I have built the piazza and a few outside improvements it will require another 1,000 feet.

"I used 50 pounds of large nails, 15 pounds of spikes, and 20 pounds of shingle nails. I drove every one of them myself, and I didn't hit my thumb as many times as you might expect.

"After that I shall paint the house, and then—I've got to build a barn. Do you see that fine, English bred colt out there?" she said, pointing to a sleek young horse in the next lot. "Well, that's Kitty. She is a valuable colt, and we think the world of her. She has got to have a home, too, and I must build it."

BALLOONING AS A TONIC.

Dr. Naugier, a French Physician, Declares Air Voyages Benefit Anemics.

Dr. Naugier asserted at the latest meeting of the academy of medicine at Paris that experiments he has made demonstrate that a balloon ascension acts on the human system as the most powerful tonic known.

Dr. Naugier believes that the good effect begins to be felt immediately, and that a lengthened stay in the air is only detrimental in causing nervous irritation. The municipal council will be asked to provide a large balloon, one capable of taking up in the upper air daily 50 patients, or children who are too poor to afford a change of climate.

POINTS FOR A BARBER.

Qualifications Which Go to Make Up the Polite, Attentive and Successful Artist.

At the meeting of the New York State Barbers' association in Brooklyn the other day, Mr. Prinz delivered a course of instruction, and among other things said: "When you get an apprentice see that he has a fair education and the actions of a gentleman, and don't let him chew tobacco or use it in any form during business hours. Don't let him get too fresh with the customers. And another thing, should a customer make a complaint of a barber the barber should not violate that confidence, but consider it a professional secret." There are said to be 81,000 barbers in New York state.

TEST OF NEW GUN.

Disappearing Gun Carriages of Mounts on Fischer's Island Work Satisfactorily.

The board of which Col. Randolph is president, appointed to test and report upon the disappearing gun carriages, returned from Fischer's island, where the tests of the twelve, ten and six-inch guns mounted on disappearing carriages were made. The tests were very satisfactory, especially with the larger gns. Thirty shots were fired from the ten-inch gun with an average interval of 53 seconds between each shot. Ten shots were fired from the 12-inch gun, with an average interval of 59 seconds between each shot. This broke the record in the firing of guns of such size.

Dense Population in Belgium. The recent census returns show that the population of Belgium now stands at 8,693,816, having doubled during the last 9 years. Belgium is now the most densely populated country in Europe.

WOMAN A PESSIMIST.

After a Certain Age Their Faces Show Signs of Mental Worry and Distress.

The average woman is a dyed-in-the-wool pessimist. Almost every woman over 30 years of age looks distressed. Her brows are bent, her mouth drawn into a tight line, and there are deep furrows down her cheeks. She looks exactly as if she were considering how to provide a dinner for 25 cents that will satisfy twenty-five small children, when in reality she may have nothing more serious on her mind than buying a pair of socks for George. No wonder women grow old faster than men, for they hug their worries to them and let them show in their faces.

There was once an elderly servant who was superstitious to a degree and who always expected the worst to happen. Did she find a needle on the floor, did a picture fall in the house or a bird fly into one of the rooms, she was instantly plunged into woe. "We're going to have a heap of bad luck!" she would say, and then she'd be lachrymose until some one had the toothache or the cows got into the corn, when she would consider the demon luck exorcised or satisfied for a time and grow as cheerful as if it was her habit to be. Some one once asked her if she did not have any good-luck signs. "Why, certainly," she replied, "but they don't count—I don't believe in the good-luck ones," which, by the by, is thoroughly characteristic of the sex.

Death Caused by Mosquito.

Mosquitoes are now charged with communicating erysipelas as well as malaria and yellow fever. A New York physician has issued a death certificate in the case of a 14 months' old babe, in which he says "Death was caused by erysipelas due to the bite of a mosquito." It is only fair to the mosquito to record that the board of health officers refused to accept the certificate until a coroner's physician had investigated and concluded that there was no other apparent cause for the death than the mosquito bite.—Youth's Companion.

"Coffee Heart" is the Latest.

Medical examiners for life insurance societies have added the term "coffee heart" to their regular classification of the functional derangements of that organ. Its effect is in shortening the long beat of the heart. Coffee toppers, they say, are plentiful, and are as much tied to their cups as the whisky toper. The effect of the coffee upon the heart is more lasting, and consequently worse, than that of liquor.—Dietetic and Hygienic Gazette, London.
