

COMMISSIONERS' COURT.

Bridge Across South Fork of Nehalem River Decided Upon at Roy's Place.

The Board of County Commissioners, consisting of County Judge W. W. Conder and Commissioners Geo. W. Bodyfelt and Geo. Loerpabel, met on Wednesday and Thursday and transacted the following business:

In the matter of building a bridge across the South fork of Nehalem river, this caused quite a discussion. It was, however, eventually decided to build the bridge, and to call for bids at the next term of court, and in the meantime the roadmaster was to procure the length of the bridge. Another thing which caused some discussion was the location. The court asked Roadmaster Hickey for his opinion, and his reply was that it should be at Roy's. H. V. Alley and Felix Roy was of the same opinion. Commissioner Loerpabel had no objection to the bridge being built there if the court would do so without further delay, and this being agreed to, it was so ordered.

In the matter of a way of necessity on the petition of C. N. Illingsworth, it appearing to the Court that the viewers who were appointed had failed to do so, it was ordered that John Hickey, Fred Sappington and Frank Hobson be appointed a board of county road viewers to meet at C. N. Illingsworth's on the 23rd Sept.

In the matter of the application of the Hadley Lumber Company for license and permission to use a public highway for the purpose of anchoring a boom for logging purposes on the Wilson river, it appearing to the Court that this did not in any way interfere with the travel, it was granted.

In the matter of the George N. Hodgson road, the same being a road of easement, this was granted and the road be opened as a public easement.

In the matter of the petition of James Christensen for a county road, the reports having been recorded, it was ordered that it be made a public highway.

In the matter of the appointment of P. McIntosh as manager of the exhibit at the Lewis and Clark Fair, it was ordered that the appointment be made.

In the matter of the appointment of George Allendorf and Frank Webster as fire wardens, the same was approved.

In the matter of the bond of A. Arstall, as road supervisor R. D. No. 6, the same was accepted.

In the matter of the deed from J. H. Holgate and wife for a county road it was ordered that the same be approved.

In the matter of the bond of Carl Haberlach as justice of the peace, the same was approved.

In the matter of the bond of W. D. Wood for Wilson river bridge the same was approved.

In the matter of the agreement of W. D. Wood for bridge work the same was approved.

In the matter of tax sales of land of Giles Schrief for 1891, the same was cancelled.
