UNSEEN DANGER IS ON OUR TRACK.
From the time of our birth till we lie down for the last time,

There is due the association for cheese from merchants, \$1,741.50, being for part of November and December cheese.
The association has notes outstanding in favor of Geo. Cohn as follows: Three notes at \$500.00 each. There are notes outstanding for stock subscription in favor of the association in the amount of \$812.50. Of the total of stock subscribed there is paid in the sum of \$637.50, the total amount subscribed being \$1,450.00.

At this time \$1,000.00, have been paid off of the original indebtedness of twenty-five hundred dollars. As soon as sufficient returns are in for cheese, the association will be enabled to pay off \$500.00 in addition to the foregoing.
The cost of the cheese factory as at present equipped was \$2,500.00.

I believe that the amount of milk received at the factory was far in excess of the expectations of the promoters, and indications point toward receipts during the present year at almost three million pounds of milk. Present indications are also for a good price for cheese for the fore part of the present year, and if the cutting of prices of cheese as indulged in last year by certain factories can be stopped, it would seem that the producers should get a more uniform price the year around. It would seem that by the directors of the several co-operative factories conferring together at stated periods, that contention between different communities would be to a greater extent eliminated.
