**WANTED, A PUTTY JUDGE**

**One that Won't Balk or Squirm Preferred.**

The HEADLIGHT man has taken little part in the primary nominating election, as it is an election "of the people, by the people, and for the people," nor has he indulged in any personalities and mud-slinging, the same as some of the candidates and newspapers of the county did. But there is one thing he wishes to call attention to, and that is to the effort to boost a "Putty Man" for a "Putty County Judge." And to prove what he wants to make plain, he will have to republish that famous contract which County Judge Conder unwittingly signed and which saddled an extra expense, or "graft" if you prefer to call it by that name, upon the county for doing the work for which District Attorney McNary and Sheriff Woolfe are drawing salaries. There was no necessity to employ somebody else to do these officers work, and in that way put the county to extra expense, which will ultimately come out of the pockets of the taxpayers. Read the famous contract. Here it is:

"It is hereby agreed by and between Tillamook County, Oregon, and the law firm of Handley & Thayer, shall as attorneys for Tillamook County, Oregon, immediately commence to enforce by all necessary and practicable legal process all claims which the said county has against anyone by reason of the delinquency of H. H. Alderman, late sheriff and ex-officio tax collector of said county, and by reason of any illegal compromise of taxes heretofore made with any one, and by reason of any other delinquency on the part of any person liable to the said county on any account and shall diligently prosecute the same to a determination;

"Provided no suit or action in the courts shall be instituted without the sanction of the County Judge of said county, and the said Handley & Thayer shall receive as compromise for services, five per cent of \$1,600 delinquency of said H. H. Alderman, secured by tax collector's bonds if the same is made without legal process, with legal process 10 per cent thereon;

"Twenty-five per cent of all sums made on account of the aforesaid sheriff and tax collector's delinquency, in excess of the aforesaid \$1,600; and 40 per cent on all sums made on any other claim due the said county; a retainer of \$100 to be paid on the execution of this contract.

"Executed in duplicate.  
 "Witness our hands this 7th day of September, 1904.  
 "TILLAMOOK COUNTY, OREGON,  
 "By W. W. CONDER, County Judge.  
 "HANDLEY & THAYER."

Neither Commissioner Bodyfelt nor Commissioner Loerpel saw or read this contract until it was published in the Headlight, and this came about as the result of Handley & Thayer sending out duns to those who were delinquent with their taxes, and in answer to an inquiry as to their authority and power to run the sheriff's office, we published the above contract.

Just refer to another specification in the contract. It is this: "Provided no suit or action in the courts shall be instituted without the sanction of the county judge of said county." This means that Judge Conder was the "whole thing," have the "whole say," and that Commissioners Bodyfelt and Loerpel have "no say," simply shut out from having "any say," in the matter, yet they are members of the county court. But the funny part of the business is that in the three foolish suits which were brought against Mrs. Alderman and the still more foolish suit which was brought against Homer Mason, all of which the county lost and had to pay the costs of the suits, the commissioners have to allow the bills and the taxpayers have to foot the costs. As long as the taxpayers don't object to doing so and this system of "graft," it will continue.

Now as to the point we want to impress upon the taxpayers and something for them to talk and think over before they cast their votes next week.

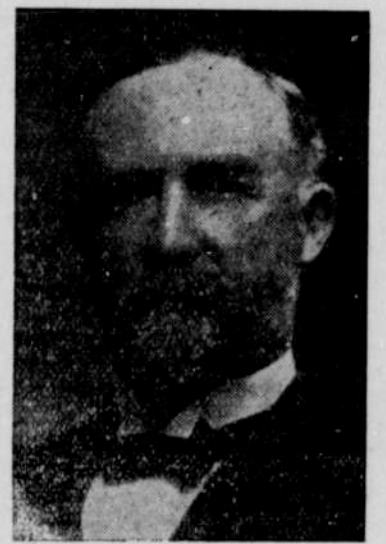
As Judge Conder will be out of office when the Alderman affair is settled and the bill for "compromise" is presented for payment, as specified in the above contract, it will never do to have a county judge who is balky and refuse to allow the bill, consequently, what is the next move is to get a Putty County Judge, one who will do as he is told and won't balk when it comes to taking money out of the county treasury to pay a firm of attorneys a lot of money for doing the work of the district attorney and the sheriff, which is a double expense to the taxpayers, or, in popular parlance, is called "Public Graft!"

If the taxpayers of Tillamook want a Putty County Judge they can get him. But don't squirm when the grafters get in their work. That is all. Vote as you please.

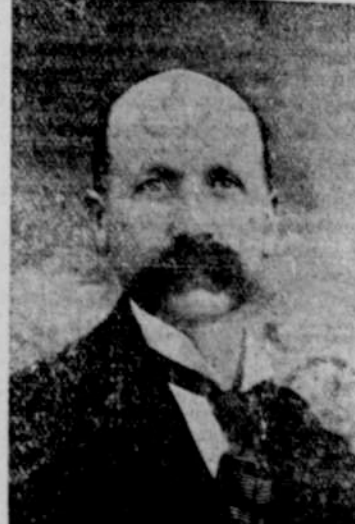
