Belshazzar.

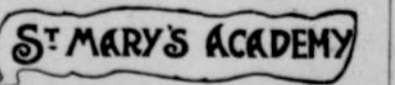

 For Cutting Obstructed Teats.
 Illustration shows instrument both open for cutting and closed for inserting. This obstruction may be a stricture or other growth of a tumorous nature, which is often the result of the bite of a dog, a kick or a bruise caused by going over a fence or through a dense underbrush; or the cow may have had some trouble with that quarter of her bag, and in milking and forcing the thickly curdled milk out, a small rupture had resulted, so that when the scar tissue formed, the opening became smaller.
