HAMMOND ORDERS THE WORK RUSHED.

Grading to be Commenced by September 1 on Seaside-Tillamook Line.

From The Oregonian. Instead of waiting the coming of Spring to start work on the Tillamook extension of the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad, as the plan of A. B. Hammond was when he was in Portland a few weeks ago, work will be commenced on grading for the line within the next few weeks. Preliminary work is being rushed and by September 1 construction gangs will probably be busy leveling the ground for the laying of new track.

Engineer Taylor has been on the ground to be traversed by the Hammond extension already, and gives his opinion that he can build a road to Tillamook down the coast on practically a water grade. This work, he says, will prove expensive but he can secure the desired gradients without serious difficulty.

Since the visit of Mr. Hammond in Portland and his announcement that the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad will be extended to the Nehalem and Tillamook sections, officials of his lines have been busy arranging for an early commencement of actual work. It has been found that a large part of the work prior to the laying of the rails on the extension can be done before the heavy rains of the winter set in. It is hoped to have the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad line into Tillamook early next year.

Mr. Hammond holds the record for being the man who has talked less about what he intended doing in railroad building than any other who is interested in the situation in this state. His promises have never outrun performance; on the contrary, as in the present instance, his method is rather to begin building operations before he gives his plans any general public discussion.

Representatives of Mr. Hammond are in Portland securing instruments to close up the surveys as soon as possible. Engineer Taylor has been instructed to push the work, and by early next year it is expected that conductors on A. & C. trains will be shouting "Tillamook" to announce the arrival at the southern terminus of the road.

BEGIN SURVEY ON TILLAMOOK LINE. Astoria & Columbia Putting Force in Field for Big Extension.

J. W. Taylor, executive engineer of the United Railways Company, has resigned to work for the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad in directing the surveying and location of the proposed extension from Seaside to Tillamook. Mr. Taylor, accompanied by his men, departed last night for Astoria, whence he will start immediately to the new territory.

Two crews of 14 men each will take the field first. They will cover both the coast and inside routes, to determine which is the most feasible. The route which offers the lowest grade will be selected, the cost in this case being the least important. Because of this fact, there is a chance that the extension will be built along the beach, though it would prove expensive construction. The inside line is expected to offer many obstacles, but if these do not interfere with grades, the location may be made there.

The length of the extension will be about 40 miles by the inside route, and tunneling will be necessary, in addition to heavy cuts. The Nevacum and Nehalem Rivers will be followed to obtain low grades. Completion of the extension will give the A. & C. a total length of track of approximately 110 miles. The road being constructed to Tillamook by the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company, having its eastern terminus at Hillsboro, will be 81

miles long, and make the most direct route from Portland to Tillamook, about 100 miles, as against 150 miles by Astoria. Both roads will share in the large amount of dairy products and farm stuff which will be sent to the local market, and heavy lumber traffic to be developed. The A. & C. will probably be well under way by next season, so Canon Beach and other resorts can be reached, though another year will be required to finish the P. R. & N. road to the bay.—Telegram.

Schooners Built in Tillamook. Morning Star, of 50 tons, was the first schooner built in Tillamook, in the year 1855, by O. Thomas, W. N. Vaughn, Peter Morgan and Mr. Hendrickson. The iron was obtained from the wreck of the English man-of-war Shark, which went ashore on the beach. Mr. Vaughn has the whip saw and most of the blacksmith tools which did the work on this schooner back in 1855, and which will be on exhibit at the Fair.

The Ellen and the Champion, each of 50 tons, were built by James Quick at the present steamboat landing in this city. The Rosalitha, of 80 tons, was built at the same place by E. Trask.

The Brant was built at Netarts by Thomas and Awnley, and had a carrying capacity of 75 tons. The Augusta was built at the landing in this city by Mr. Miller, and was of 20 tons burthen.

The Terwilliger was built at Bay City by William Terwilliger, who lost his life in her on the first voyage, for she was wrecked at Tillamook Head, where she went to pieces.

The Minnie Miller, a small steamer, was built in this city by Mr. Miller. Mr. Vaughn has the kettle which steamed the plank for all of these vessels, which he will exhibit at the Fair.

Declares Toll Roads Should be Condemned by the State.

In the opinion of E. F. Cannon of the Automobile club, the state should condemn the toll roads between Portland and Tillamook and should assist the county in making passable highways of them. The proposition may be brought before the club at its next meeting.

Mr. Cannon in company with O. W. Olsen, returned yesterday afternoon from a nine days' trip over the roads between here and Tillamook. The start was made a week ago last Thursday in Cannon's runabout. Going the party traveled by way of Newberg, McMinnville, Dallas, to Fall City, back to Dallas again, on to Sheridan and over the Sheridan road to Tillamook, arriving at Tillamook Monday night. They left Tillamook Monday, traveling by the Wilson river road to Forest Grove and by that way to Portland, arriving here yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock, the whole distance covered being about 400 miles.

Mr. Cannon said last night that the trip was made simply with the purpose of getting a line on the roads traveled. After getting the line, he decided that the roads were about the poorest in the state, especially the toll roads which lead into Tillamook county, the Wilson river and the Sheridan roads. The Wilson river road, said Cannon, is much the poorer of the two, being full of much holes and lined with rickety bridges. For an ordinary heavy auto it is practically impassable. The Sheridan road is in much better condition, but the grades are stronger and heavier. The Wilson river road could be made a first class road, while the Sheridan grade could be reduced materially by proper engineering.
