COUNTY AFFAIRS.

Tax Levy is 14 Mills--Road Supervisors Appointed--The Jury List.

The Commissioners' Court was in session on Wednesday until Saturday night, and in addition to the business reported in our last issue, transacted the following:

In the matter of Amon Rose's taxes, for 1897, the same having been paid, they were ordered cancelled.

Reports of surveyors of road districts Nos. 3, 4, and 5 were approved.

Claim of Frank Norberg for \$4.00 was continued.

Claim of S. V. Anderson, for wood, for \$22.50, was rejected, having been allowed in another bill.

In the matter of the agreement between the county and the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad Co., the latter having filed an application for an agreement for the privilege of crossing, use and occupancy of certain public roads in Tillamook County, entered into an agreement with the county to that effect.

Petition of H. F. Fraser for county road, the road viewers having reported, it was ordered that it be placed on file and that henceforth the road shall be considered a public highway, and the supervisor directed to open road.

In the matter of the claim of McNair & Co. against county, bill was ordered paid when same was endorsed by the persons who made the purchase.

In the matter of the contract between the county and Fred Kebbe to build a road, the clerk was ordered to draw a warrant in payment of the balance when the work is accepted in writing by the County Surveyor.

In the matter of the petition of the Bay City Land Co., the same was continued.

In the matter of the claim of Herman Schollmeyer for damages, he was allowed \$50, to be paid when road is opened, and the suit instituted in the circuit court to be dismissed.

In the matter of the petition of the Oregon & California R. R. Co. to cancel taxes of certain land, the same was ordered cancelled.

The road supervisors who were appointed were: No. 1, Fred Zaddach; No. 2, John Hickey; No. 3, M. C. Trow; No. 4, Guy Vaughn; No. 5, H. M. Farmer; No. 6, A. Arstall.

In the matter of the petition of the Pacific Railway & Navigation Co., for the appropriation and use of certain portions of the county roads, as shown in petition, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining thereon its line of railway, as was surveyed, the same was granted; also an agreement with the company.

In the matter of the road tax collected in the limits of Tillamook City it was ordered that three mills of the county road tax be credited to the city.

In the matter of the road tax collected in Nehalem City, it was ordered that three mills be credited to that city.

In the matter of the bridge across Trask river at the Johnson place, the surveyor was ordered to select a location, secure deeds for roadway, and draw plans and specifications for a combination bridge, and report the same at the next term of court.

In the matter of the deed of Herman Schollmeyer, for Coal Creek road, was approved.

In the matter of purchasing ground for roadway and allowing damages to Adolph Erickson for road, the clerk was ordered to draw a warrant for \$250, when the deed is filed.

In the matter of compensation for labor and road supervisors, it was ordered that laborers be paid at the rate of 25 cents per hour and road supervisors \$2.50 per day of eight hours. It was also ordered that men working on county roads furnish their own shovels, axes and mattocks.

In the matter of agreement between the county and the Pacific Railway & Navigation Co., the same was accepted. And it was ordered that the County Clerk extend tax levy on the assessment roll for the year 1906, together with all the special school and city taxes, and place a warrant on the 1906 tax roll for its collection.

The Tillamook Headlight and Herald were designated official newspapers and to print all notices for \$85 each.

The County Clerk was ordered to advertise for 15 cords of green alder, vine maple or spruce limbs.

Claim of Handley & Thayer, for \$108, for collecting delinquent taxes, was continued.

Claim of D. D. West, for \$75, for dam-

age to horse, was allowed in the sum of \$50.

Claim of P. W. Todd for \$30.36, for salary while Carl Haberlach was county treasurer, was continued.
